Frequently Asked Questions

Can I wear a helmet and be a member?
Yes, ABATE strives to ensure all motorcyclists reserve the right to choose to wear a helmet or not. ABATE's stance is not Anti-Helmet, but rather Anti-Helmet Law. The factors of helmet use are too complex for a simple statistic, so ABATE believes, before government law needlessly endanger lives, that such a decision should be left to the rider, and pursue other venues of motorcycle safety--primarily education and awareness.

Do I need to be a Harley owner?
No, ABATE is an advocate for the rights of all motorcyclists, regardless of what or where they ride.

Do I need to own a motorcycle?
No, ABATE consists of all advocates of motorcyclists and motorcycling. The rights of which may be supported by anyone who cares, and are welcome to do so.

Do I have to live in Kansas?
No, ABATE of Kansas has many non-Kansas-resident members who still ride in Kansas. ABATE of Kansas does not believe the rights of motorcyclists stop at the state borderline. ABATE of Kansas works with other state and national Motorcycle Rights Organizations (MROs) to preserve rights wherever the road leads.

Is ABATE a motorcycle club?
No, ABATE of Kansas is classified as a lobbying organization.

Which District can I belong to?
You can belong to any district you prefer. Districts are divided by county groups, except District 20 which is mostly out-of-state members, however also choose districts adjacent to their state, if preferred. You may choose any district based on where you work, live, or have social ties. The only restriction is that you can only belong to one district at a time.

Why did I stop getting a newsletter?
Chances are most likely you have either moved or your membership has expired. Please check with your district or the ABATE of Kansas State office. It may also be you are not listed with your local post office. Please check with them to make sure you are listed at that address.

Do I need my ABATE card?
Yes, keep your membership card with you when you can. At events, it's faster and more reliable than roster checking. Also, many of your stops may give discounts for ABATE members.

Is ABATE just about helmets?
No, ABATE monitors all bills, laws, and regs that impact motorcycling, including manufacturing, operation, environment and education.

Do I need a permit to camp on leased area at Lake Perry?
Yes, permits are required by the Corp of Engineers which are requested and obtained from the ABATE of Kansas State office in Perry, the only exception being if you plan to camp during the Labor Day Rally event.

**Proposed Bylaw Changes To Be Discussed At Next BOD Meeting****Article II Section 2****Membership**

Election of Members. Any person interested in becoming a member of the corporation shall submit a completed electronic or paper membership application, approved by the Board of Directors, to the secretary of the corporation. Applicants become approved members of the corporation on payment of the required membership fee and approval of the membership committee. The membership fee will be set by the Board of Directors.

Article VII Section 2**Contracts, Checks, Deposits, and Funds**

Checks, Drafts, or Orders. All checks, drafts, or orders for payment of money, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of and on behalf of the corporation, shall be signed in such manner as shall be determined by resolution of the Board of Directors. In the absence of such determination by the Board of Directors, such instruments shall be signed by the treasurer or assistant treasurer and countersigned by the president and vice president of the corporation.

The State Board of Directors shall allow the issuance of 1 debit card for the necessary expense's to prepare for events on a State level. This SHALL not apply to the Districts.

Legislative Agenda

Right-of-Way HB 2079

If passed, it will increase the fines and penalties for violation of the right-of-way statutes. Currently the fine is \$50.00 plus \$37.50 court costs. The proposed legislation would increase the fines by \$40.00.

Safety Corridor HB 2358

A Safety Corridor, to protect the traveling public, may be designated by the Secretary of Transportation based on it meeting certain criteria. It is similar to a work zone, and fines will be doubled for exceeding the posted speed limit.

House Concurrent Resolution No. 5008

This resolution encourages the Kansas Department of Transportation to make engineering decisions based upon established professional findings and methodologies rather than political considerations.

Alcohol Bill HB 2206

If passed, this bill will allow hard liquor to be sold in grocery and convenience stores. ABATE's position is to support small businesses, and passage of this bill would hurt locally-owned businesses.

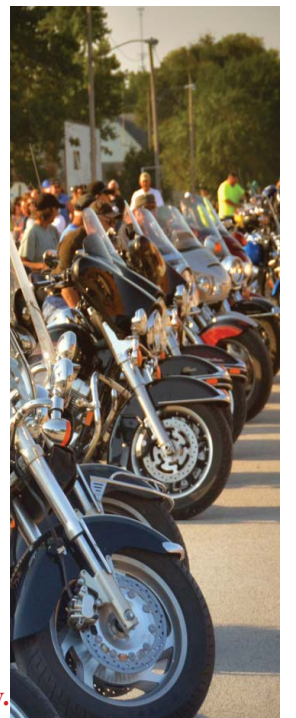

Protecting Your Rights in our Nation's Capital



Recently Congresswoman Lynn Jenkins visited with folks in Iola, Chanute and Marysville over coffee. She toured some businesses and was invited to assist in presenting an award to one of the businesses. Visit her web site to see the details. The following are excerpts from her post:

“Secretary Sebelius Fails to Address Obama Care Navigator Security Concerns:

Under the Affordable Care Act Secretary Kathleen Sebelius and her department were charged with setting up the Navigator Program, which is designed to certify individuals to assist with enrollment in the Federal Health Care Exchange. Four months ago, I sent a letter to Secretary Sebelius expressing concerns and questioning the Navigator program and whether Americans are safe from fraud under this law.

This week I received a response from Secretary Sebelius, and unfortunately after reviewing the response, Secretary Sebelius and her department confirmed that they failed to set up basic safeguards to the Navigators Program. The law has been in place for four years and while they say they are working on it, HHS still hasn't approved standards that would prevent felons from accessing your most private information including Social Security numbers, financial data, and health records. Secretary Sebelius also informed me that no navigators will be fired for ethical lapses, and no formal ethical training will take place. If a navigator has acted in an unethical manner, they will be basically placed on navigator probation.

This is extremely troubling and shows how vulnerable the President's healthcare law is to fraud. The Navigator Program must be put on hold until proper safeguards are put in place and Secretary Sebelius can guarantee the safety and privacy of Kansans are not put at risk.

Holding the Administration Accountable for Executive Orders:

Last week, I signed a letter to Attorney General Eric Holder requesting an explanation of the constitutional authority under which President Obama intends to carry out his pledge to use his 'pen' to sidestep Congress. This behavior is disheartening, and certainly no way to rebuild confidence in Washington's ability to lead.

The President's most recent executive delay of his own healthcare law was issued a day after the Congressional Budget Office (CBO) released a negative report on the adverse effects the healthcare law will have on the American workforce. One thing is clear, the President does not have the authority to issue executive orders and override laws made by Congress for political reasons.

IRS Targeting Conservative Groups:

Over the past six months, the committee I serve on, the Ways and Means Committee, has been taking action to prevent overreach by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). These hearings have uncovered an organized effort by the IRS to silence targeted conservative groups. Last week, the Ways and Means Committee approved legislation that prohibits the agency from finalizing a regulation that will limit the free speech and advocacy efforts of 501(c)(4) organizations. The Stop Targeting of Political Beliefs by the IRS Act of 2014, ensures the IRS is not able to further regulate the very groups they

have been discriminating against. The IRS has lost the public's trust for its failure to enforce the laws fairly and for its lack of transparency or accountability. The Ways and Means Committee is continuing to investigate the IRS' conduct and hold those responsible for politicizing the agency.”

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has issued a proposed rule that would affect the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) and every other advocacy group with the same tax status. The MRF has what is known as 501(C) 4 tax status, this means the MRF can be involved in political activities, however donations to the MRF are not tax deductible for the person or group that donates the money.

Recently the IRS seems to be unfairly targeting conservative tea party type groups. Now its time to punish everyone because the current IRS does not care for the way that some of these groups have been successful in getting out the vote and raising money. 501(c) 4's are named after the section of U.S. code that defines them. Some of the tea party type groups are also in the (c) 4 grouping, as a “social welfare” group.

The 501(c)4 is the segment of the nonprofit world best known for organizations like Karl Rove's Crossroads GPS and the liberal group, Priorities USA. 501(c) 4's are in fact made up of over 86,000 mostly small organizations nationwide, some of which are almost certainly active participants in our own community's civic life. They weren't invented in the last election cycle; they've been around for generations. Their purpose isn't to hide donors; it's to advance policies. The big famous guys and the shady newcomers get all the attention, but they aren't typical of the sector, any more than Justin Bieber reflect the experience of the bulk of the people making a living in the music industry. It is true that political spending has skyrocketed since 2008 in the (c) 4 category and that some reform to those groups spending astronomical amounts of money for election purposes is warranted.

This tax status allows the MRF to “be involved in the political process” so long as the primary purpose of the organization is not partisan politics. Under the proposed rules we would be limited to doing work around elections and key votes. The IRS said in a hearing this past Wednesday that they have received an “unprecedented” number of comments and that the “rules would not be finalized anytime soon”.

At this point it is not clear whether the government planned to change the rules for all 501(c) groups, including (c)(5)'s (labor unions) and (c)(6)'s (trade associations).

The new rule would limit what political

activities the MRF and other (c) 4's could do before election dates. What would be considered a “political activity” is not known. It could be as simple as a meeting with an elected official on an issue important to their constituents, a get out the vote effort or even endorsement of candidates.

By confusing protected political speech with electioneering, this proposed rule would silence social welfare non-profit organizations for a minimum of 90-days during an election year. However, because the regulation applies to elections at every level of government, and some state and local governments host elections on odd years, or in differing months of the year, free speech for (c) 4 organizations conceivably could be restricted every year. This is unacceptable and out of line with our form of government. (c) 4 social welfare non-profit organizations serve a valuable role in society and it would be unjust to prohibit their speech. A final ruling could be years away.

The MRF will keep you updated on this issue.

Motorcycle Riders Foundation Congratulates ABATE of Illinois

On Wednesday, February 26th ABATE of Illinois made history. They successfully lobbied for a resolution that was passed by the State House of Representatives. The resolution throws the weight of the general assembly behind a federal bill that would conduct a scientific study on the effects of the new blend of fuel known as E15. This new blend is up from the previously approved blend of E10 fuel that contains up to 10% ethanol.

When the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued the waiver that allowed for the sale of E15 they did not study the effects of the blend on the internal components of an engine. In fact, motorcycles are not even on the list of vehicles approved by the EPA to use the new blend. Using the blend in a motorcycle, boat, lawn mower etc could be a violation of federal law as they were not included in the waiver.

The Illinois general assembly resolution supports H.R. 875, a bill in the United States House of Representatives that would halt the sale of E15 until an independent scientific study is conducted on the effects of E15 on motorcycles and every other vehicle. Representative Sensenbrenner (R-WI) sponsored the bill.

“This sends a crystal clear message to Washington. A top corn growing state is telling the EPA to do its homework” Said Jeff Hennie Vice President of Government Relations and Public Affairs for the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF). He added “The EPA never even considered what the E15 could do to a small air cooled engine or really any other engine except for a handful of passenger vehicles.”

The MRF salutes ABATE of Illinois for

their tremendous leadership and bravery. They continue to be one of the models of how a State Motorcycle Rights Organization (SMRO) should work.

Motorcycle Checkpoint Bill Introduced in U.S. Senate

The United States Senate is seeking to end the unfair practice of federally funded motorcycle-only roadside checkpoints, reports the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF). Senator Jeanne Shaheen (D-NH) has introduced legislation, which would further prohibit the federal government from funding mandatory motorcycle-only roadside checkpoints. Joining her as the lead republican on the bill is Senator Ron Johnson. Also joining, as original co-sponsors, are Senators Joe Manchin (D-WV) and Kelly Ayotte (R-NH).

The federal government funded motorcycle-only checkpoints through a \$70,000 grant in 2011. Georgia state police conducted two mandatory motorcycle only checkpoints. They timed the checkpoints with Daytona Florida bike week traffic setting up on the southbound lanes of I-75 and I-95 on March 9th 2012, the same day Daytona bike week began. They did the same setup during the closing day, but set up in the northbound lanes.

The MRF supports this legislation to end these checkpoints whole-heartedly and will be working with the United States Senate to pass this important legislation.

"Motorcycles are an important part of New Hampshire's identity and economy," Shaheen said. "These checkpoints unfairly target motorcycle riders who already have their vehicles inspected and registered just like all motorists. We don't have checkpoints that stop cars to check their tire pressure and we shouldn't for motorcycles either."

“We commend Senator Shaheen for taking on this troubling and important issue,” Said Jeff Hennie, Vice President Government Relations for the Motorcycle Riders Foundation. “To use taxpayer dollars to inconvenience motorcyclists is a practice that should be stopped immediately and we look forward to working with both Senators Shaheen and Johnson to accomplish that.”

Some states are addressing this issue by either prohibiting any motorcycle-only checkpoints, such as Missouri, Virginia, California, North Carolina, or prohibiting the state from receiving any federal dollars like they did in New Hampshire and Illinois.

The MRF urges you to contact both your U.S. Senators and ask them to co-sponsor this important piece of legislation; a bill number is expected soon. The MRF will keep you informed on this important issue.
