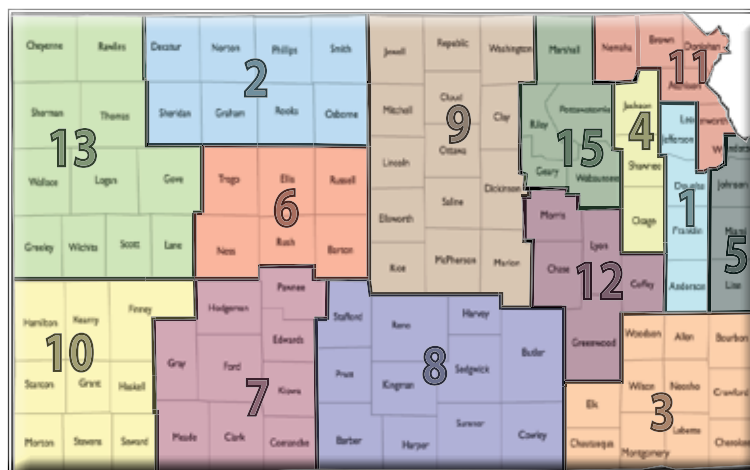

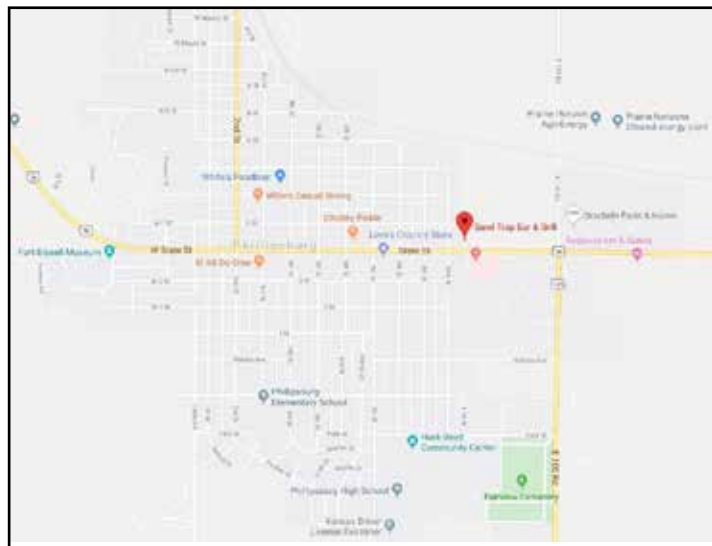

Motorcycle Awareness Report by Steve Christenberry

Hello, everyone: I'll start this month's report by describing an interview conducted by the Kansas Turnpike Authority. This interview was conducted with over-the-road truckers, auto drivers, and other groups, to gain information about users' feelings about the safety of the KTA infrastructure, as well as utilization by the people in the various groups they interviewed. They contacted ABATE of Kansas to access representatives from the motorcycle community, and I, among other ABATE members, was asked to participate. The interview was held on October 29th. There were two interviewers from KTA, and as it turned out, I was the lone interviewee. They had sent out an interview format, with questions, before the event, so I was able to get a bit of feedback from two other ABATE members. With that and my impressions, I participated in the interview, which was recorded so they could re-

view to better understand the conversation. The main focus, from the KTA perspective, was the infrastructure of the turnpike and facilities, and how do we as users perceive how safe it is. From a pure safety standpoint, in my mind, the turnpike is far safer than interstate highways and secondary 2 lane highways. The concrete lane dividers, the new barriers around the pillars on bridges, better guard rails, and no cable barriers, are examples of safety features built into the roadway. The facilities at the rest areas are also convenient and generally clean and accessible. I did note that motorcyclists and automobile users use the turnpike when they need to get somewhere quickly, but that motorcyclists not in a big hurry will tend to take secondary highways where it is more scenic and might have some curves in them. We also talked about the increased use of intelligent automotive technologies, and

how that impacts motorcyclists. I described how it took a monumental effort by the MRF and the AMA to get motorcycle representation on federal standard committees, and that we had to fight to change the preliminary standards to include recognition of motorcycles by the automotive recognition systems that are in place and under development. I also noted that to date there is little to none of that technology available on motorcycles, and if and when it does arrive it likely will only be on the high end (read most expensive) machines. The interviewers asked other questions, such as whether motorcyclists have observed other vehicles swerving in their lane, their operator's texting or on a cell phone, excessive speed, erratic driving, etc. I answered of course, just like any driver would answer. I was told that when the results of all the interviews were completed they would be tabulated and condensed into a report that would be shared with participants. I will certainly share that with

you when it is released.

Another tidbit about the KTA. If you do travel on the turnpike and use a K-Tag, you will be pleased to know that you can now order a stick on one similar to those used in 4 wheel vehicles. It is about 3 inches long and a half-inch wide and will stick on your windshield, fairing, or other non-metallic surfaces. Way better than those big sticks with suction cups that blow off the motorcycle. Just go to www.ksturnpike.com and click on the My K-Tag to order. The tags are free. I got mine in about 4 days and peeled off the protective layer and stuck in on the bottom of my windshield. Easy as that.

My last note for this month is that the State Motorcycle Safety Committee facilitated by the KTSRO will have its first meeting since February in November. It will of course be virtual, but at least we will be able to have a meeting. I'll keep you posted on what happened in a future report.





Motorcycle Awareness Report

Motorcycle Awareness Report, January 2020

Nearly 70 degrees here today, Dec 8th, and I simply had to go for a ride. Nearly 100 miles, and I nearly ran out of gas. Thank goodness the last notice that I had about 33 miles of fuel left was accurate, as I ran that down to about 10 or 15 before finding the Auburn store station with 91 octane gas. Aside from that little stress, it was good to get out as I am not putting the Spyder to bed for the winter just yet. I may have to see how it slides on ice and snow, after all.

The District 4/USMC Reserve Toys for Tots event was great, and in addition to promoting ABATE we gave away quite a few of the Look for Motorcyclist signs, thank you RC for having them. Kudos to all the other areas that had a T4T ride. It is a great cause for motorcyclists to support.

The State Motorcycle Task Force met virtually on November 4th. We discussed many things, one of which is what we will do for Motorcycle Awareness Month in 2021. You might have seen some billboards this year, but we were limited with all the shutdowns, as well as the uncertainties of funding. We hope that will be on a more even keel in 2021, and we will have specific plans after future meetings. I am still trying to find out how many rebates were provided over the year. I have partial data but not complete figures for the year.

A couple of moves in the right direction, Missouri decided to honor MSF safety course completion cards for Missouri riders who took a class on the Kansas side of the river. Missouri's

Governor also signed a bill that would allow those 26 years of age and older to ride without a helmet. We will see how many pullovers there will be when law enforcement is guessing about the rider's age. Does anyone think "profiling?" There was \$ distributed to students who completed a motorcycle class at an approved training site in Kansas. SMART, Inc. had 106 successful students in the 2W and 3W classes, and there are numerous other approved sites across Kansas, so either the students did not capitalize on the rebate program or we were impacted greater than we thought regarding COVID-19.

In case I did not mention it last month, the State Motorcycle Safety Administrators organization has changed their name to the State Motorcycle Safety Association and are opening memberships up to people like you and me. I have joined, and the KTSRO office (Motorcycle Task Force) is also a member. You too can join for a nominal fee, google SMSA and find the section to sign up.

I have signed up as an Independent Lobbyist again for the 2021 year. That means that I am an official lobbyist but that I can lobby for anything I want to. You might note that you as citizens can do the same thing without paying the \$65 lobbyist fee. You do get a badge, however, lol. My eyes will be tuned in to mostly motorcycle issues, like the hands-free driving bill that got waylaid with COVID-19 shutdowns in 2020. It should resurface in 2021.

All for now, see you in 2021.

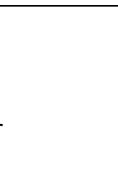

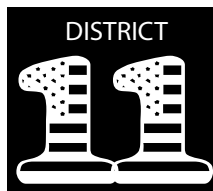

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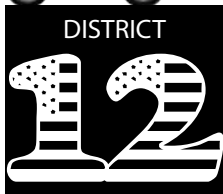

New Business:

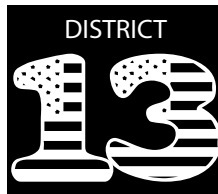

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I wear a helmet and be a member?

Yes, ABATE strives to ensure all motorcyclists reserve the right to choose to wear a helmet or not. ABATE's stance is not Anti-Helmet, but rather Anti-Helmet Law. The factors of helmet use are too complex for a simple statistic, so ABATE believes, before government law needlessly endanger lives, that such a decision should be left to the rider, and pursue other venues of motorcycle safety--primarily education and awareness.

Do I need to be a Harley owner?

No, ABATE is an advocate for the rights of all motorcyclists, regardless of what or where they ride.

Do I need to own a motorcycle?

No, ABATE consists of all advocates of motorcyclists and motorcycling. The rights of which may be supported by anyone who cares, and are welcome to do so.

Do I have to live in Kansas?

No, ABATE of Kansas has many non-Kansas-resident members who still ride in Kansas. ABATE of Kansas does not believe the rights of motorcyclists stop at the state borderline. ABATE of Kansas works with other state and national Motorcycle Rights Organizations (MROs) to preserve rights wherever the road leads.

Is ABATE a motorcycle club?

No, ABATE of Kansas is classified as a lobbying organization.

Which District can I belong

to?

You can belong to any district you prefer. Districts are divided by county groups, except District 20 which is mostly out-of-state members, however also choose districts adjacent to their state, if preferred. You may choose any district based on where you work, live, or have social ties. The only restriction is that you can only belong to one district at a time.

Why did I stop getting a newsletter?

Chances are most likely you have either moved or your membership has expired. Please check with your district or the ABATE of Kansas State office. It may also be you are not listed with your local post office. Please check with them to make sure you are listed at that address.

Do I need my ABATE card?

Yes, keep your membership card with you when you can. At events, it's faster and more reliable than roster checking. Also, many of your stops may give discounts for ABATE members.

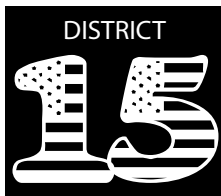
Is ABATE just about helmets?

No, ABATE monitors all bills, laws, and regs that impact motorcycling, including manufacturing, operation, environment and education.

Do I need a permit to camp on leased area at Lake Perry?

Yes, permits are required by the Corp of Engineers which are requested and obtained from the ABATE of Kansas State office in Perry, the only exception being if you plan to camp during the Labor Day Rally event.

On November 27th, I received an email from the MRF that Federal Communications Commission voted 5 to 0 to open up spectrum band previously reserved for automakers. Spectrum is the range of electromagnetic radio frequencies used to transmit sound, data, and video across the country.

For over 20 years, a specific band of the spectrum was reserved for automotive safety. The hope being that automakers would develop technology allowing cars to communicate with one another thus creating safer roadways.

During the legislative session, the Motorcycle Riders Foundation at the Meeting of the Minds in September, ABATE of Illinois strongly stated that the spectrum would impact motorcyclists nationwide. The MRF voted unanimously to add the spectrum band issue to the "2021 High Priority Objectives".

In November, the National Highway Traffic Administration changed course slightly and asked for public input on the regulations on autonomous vehicle sensors, how the vehicles detect other vehicles, and how they plan routes and how they carry out the plan.

"This rulemaking will help address legitimate public concerns about safety and pri-

vacy without hampering innovation and the development of automatic drive systems.", said Transportation Secretary Elaine Chao.

Once the notice is printed in the Federal Register, the public will have 60 days to comment on proposed regulations. Before the deadline, the MRF will draft a plan NHTSA outlining concerns of motorcyclists to ensure motorcyclists are accounted for in the development of autonomous technology.

Our state meeting was held at the ABATE of Kansas office on 12/12/20 due to the COVID and social distancing, it is very hard to plan anything beyond our 45th National Labor Day Rally. We decided our priorities for lobbying and the profiling of motorcyclists is number one at this time. Tony and I will be attending the Republican and Democratic Conventions where we hope to connect with our legislators on all motorcycle issues.

Try to practice that 70-mph social distancing as much as possible and remember to look twice save a life the life you save will probably be your own.
