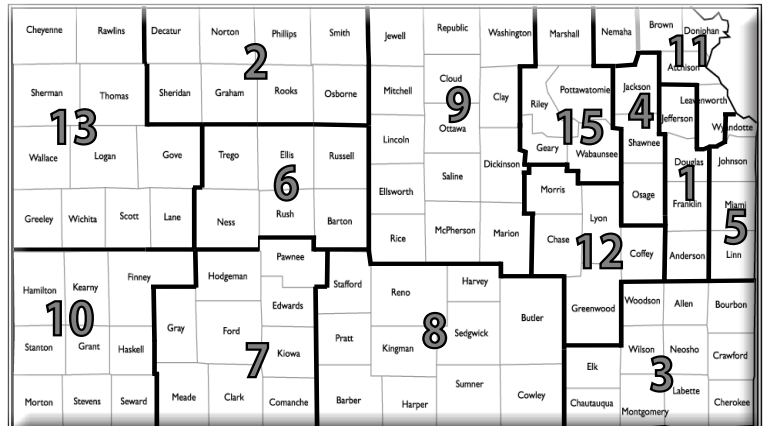

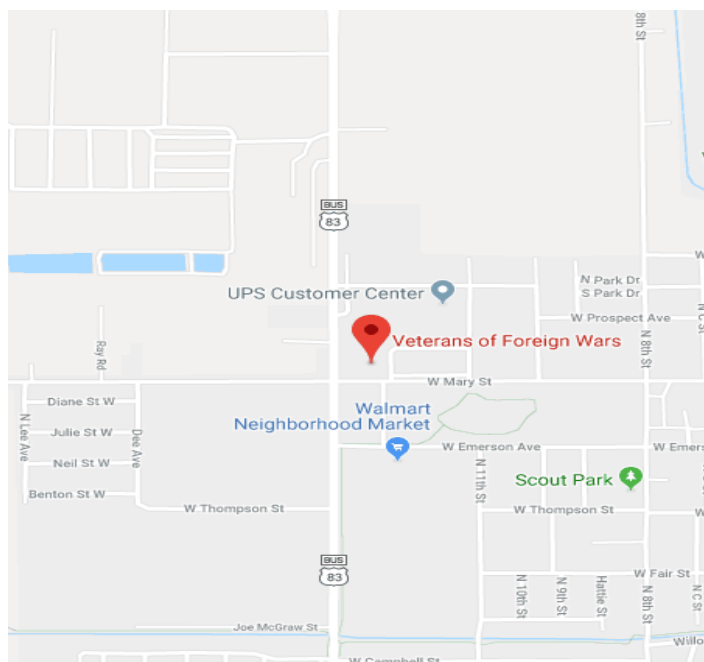

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I wear a helmet and be a member?

Yes, ABATE strives to ensure all motorcyclists reserve the right to choose to wear a helmet or not. ABATE's stance is not Anti-Helmet, but rather Anti-Helmet Law. The factors of helmet use are too complex for a simple statistic, so ABATE believes, before government law needlessly endanger lives, that such a decision should be left to the rider, and pursue other venues of motorcycle safety--primarily education and awareness.

Do I need to be a Harley owner?

No, ABATE is an advocate for the rights of all motorcyclists, regardless of what or where they ride.

Do I need to own a motorcycle?

No, ABATE consists of all advocates of motorcyclists and motorcycling. The rights of which may be supported by anyone who cares, and are welcome to do so.

Do I have to live in Kansas?

No, ABATE of Kansas has many non-Kansas-resident members who still ride in Kansas. ABATE of Kansas does not believe the rights of motorcyclists stop at the state borderline. ABATE of Kansas works with other state and national Motorcycle Rights Organizations (MROs) to preserve rights wherever the road leads.

Is ABATE a motorcycle club?

No, ABATE of Kansas is classified as a lobbying organization.

Which District can I belong to?

You can belong to any district you prefer. Districts are divided by county groups, except District 20 which is mostly out-of-state members, however also choose districts adjacent to their state, if preferred. You may choose any district based on where you work, live, or have social ties. The only restriction is that you can only belong to one district at a time.

Why did I stop getting a newsletter?

Chances are most likely you have either moved or your membership has expired. Please check with your district or the ABATE of Kansas State office. It may also be you are not listed with your local post office. Please check with them to make sure you are listed at that address.

Do I need my ABATE card?

Yes, keep your membership card with you when you can. At events, it's faster and more reliable than roster checking. Also, many of your stops may give discounts for ABATE members.

Is ABATE just about helmets?

No, ABATE monitors all bills, laws, and regs that impact motorcycling, including manufacturing, operation, environment and education.

Do I need a permit to camp on leased area at Lake Perry?

Yes, permits are required by the Corp of Engineers which are requested and obtained from the ABATE of Kansas State office in Perry, the only exception being if you plan to camp during the Labor Day Rally event.

LOBBYIST REPORT

On the Federal level things continue to be, in my mind, pretty much out of control. If you watch the national news or read newspapers, listen to White House reports, or look on social media you'll certainly get many views about the goings-on, which seem to be the flavor of the day. Therefore, I think I'll pretty much be quiet about Washington, aside from saying that our Kansas Congressmen and women are extremely concerned about trade wars due to tariffs imposed on other countries (who appear to plan to retaliate by imposing tariffs on the US). Pretty much every economist says this is not a good idea. In Kansas it would affect the farmers raising cattle and hogs, as well as those growing grain crops.

The Kansas Legislature's Sine die was on May 4th so they are officially adjourned for the year, and actually on time. However, the Kansas Supreme Court still has to rule on the education funding, and if they say it is insufficient or inequitable, that could result in a session in June. Candidates for the Kansas gubernatorial race have been finalized. The Republican field is: former Sen. Jim Barnett, R-Emporia, now Topeka, has named his wife, Rosie Hansen, as his lieutenant governor running mate; Secretary of State Kris Kobach, Leocompton/Wink Hartman, Rose Hill; Insurance Commissioner Ken Selzer, Leawood/Jen Sanderson, Goodland; and high schoolers Tyler Ruzich, Prairie Village/Dominic Scavuzzo, Leawood, and Joseph Tutera, Mission Hills/Phillip Clemente, Mission Woods. On the Democrat side

there are 3 candidates: Sens. Laura Kelly, D-Topeka, and Lynn Rogers, D-Wichita have registered, as have former Wichita Mayor Carl Brewer and former Gardner Mayor Chris Morrow, and the Ellsworth/Topeka/Manhattan team of former Rep./Kansas Secretary of Agriculture Josh Svaty and Katrina Lewison round out the field. This will be the first time in 20 plus years that the Democrats have multiple candidates to select from in the primaries on August 7th. Filing deadlines for all candidates, regardless of position, were June 1st. With Kobach running for Governor, that opens up elections for the Secretary of State position. Lawrence businessman Brian McClendon is the lone Democrat, but on the Republican side there is Randy Duncan from Salina, current Representation Keith Esau of Olathe, Craig McCullah of Topeka, Rep Scott Schawb of Olathe, and Dennis Taylor of Topeka. The state treasurer's race includes Republican Jake LaTurner from Topeka, and Democrat Marci Francisco. For those of you in the 47th District, George Hanna, a member of ABATE District 4, is running against the incumbent Ronald Ellis. George rides a HD Tri-Glide, has great character, and someone I personally would vote for if I was in his district.

On the second district race for Congress, State Sen. Steve Fitzgerald, R-Leavenworth, is in the race, along with State Rep. Kevin Jones, R-Wellsville, Sen. Caryn Tyson, R-Parker, Basehor Mayor Vernon Fields, Tyler Tannahill, Leavenworth, and Steve Watkins, Topeka.

Former Kansas House Minority Leader Paul Davis, D-Lawrence, and former Topeka City Councilman Nathan Schmidt, Topeka, are in a two-person Democratic primary so far. Ten-year U.S. Rep. Lynn Jenkins, R-Kan., isn't seeking re-election.

Please read Coop's MRF report in the newsletter. I also encourage you to join the MRF (Motorcycle Riders Foundation) and the American Motorcyclists Association (AMA), to stay abreast of what happens on the national front. The MRF's Meeting of the Minds is in Denver, in September, and of course we will have the MID-South MILE in Oklahoma in October.

While elections for state offices are a few months away, declared candidates are beginning to establish their positions on various issues. Listen carefully to what they say, as you'll be asked to vote

for a candidate for the party in which you are declared in the primary elections. And if you have not registered to vote, DO SO! It is our responsibility to elect our representatives, and we can't do that if we do not register to vote.

As always, please contact me with your legislative concerns and also your legislative contacts. It is always nice to be introduced to a legislator by someone who has a relationship with that person. My contact information is in the newsletter.

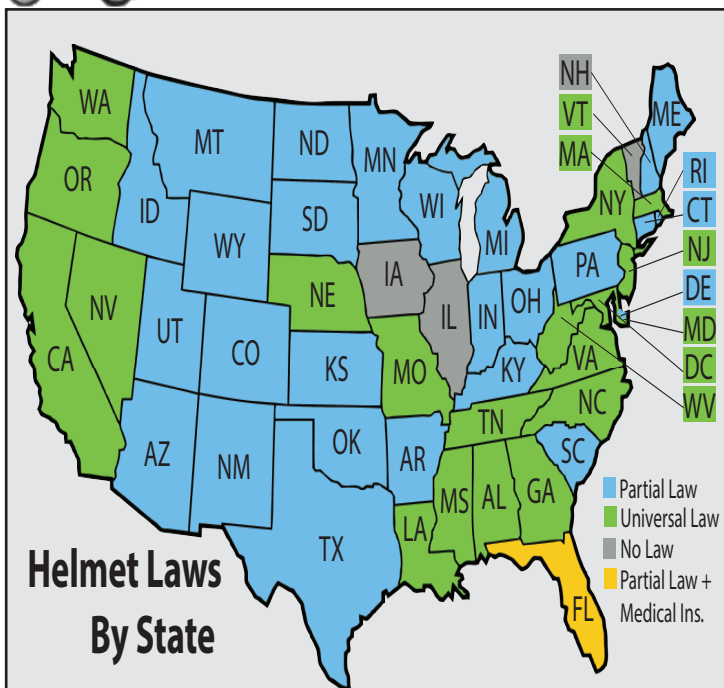

Paul reported that the gate at Paradise Point was locked this weekend. Work weekends will begin in July.

MRF Report: Meeting of the Minds will be in Denver on September 20-23. It is encouraged for ABATE of Kansas members to attend, always a good conference. The MidSouth M.I.L.E will be in Oklahoma this year in October as usual. Coop and Robin planned to attend the Bikers Inside the Beltway event in May, but they had problems on the way so they were not able to make the event after all. The annual NHTSA report came out recently and motorcycle fatalities increased 5.1% from 2015 to 2016. Now while that does not sound good, there was an increase in fatalities of 8% in 2014. Overall traffic fatality data indicates that 28% were alcohol involved. **DON'T DRINK AND RIDE!**

AMA Report: The American Motorcyclist Association reported last month that President Trump is considering allowing E15 fuel to be sold this summer, which would make it available year round (the EPA has determined that it increased pollution, and the President appears to not be in favor of restrictions to the oil industry). The AMA and MRF oppose this, and word to the wise, don't put this in any vehicle or motor that does not expressly state it is safe to do so. No need to cook your motorcycle, car, truck, go-kart, or lawn mower engines that are not approved for E15 gasoline. California still has an anti-profiling bill on the table. The hope is that it will be voted on by June 1st, but I have not heard if that happened or not.

Lobbyist Report: The full Lobbyist report is in the

newsletter, so please read it there. We will work after the elections in August to reintroduce the negligent driving bill, in conjunction with our bicycle community.

Product Report: Kerry provided a brief report about products. According to Jack the rockers are being created as we speak. Kerry brought some shirts if members are interested.

Old Business: ABATE Calendar: The State would like Districts to get this done as early as possible so with luck the calendars could be ready by Labor Day. Paul took pictures at the RFTW, using money from the RFTW savings contributions to pay for the big ad. SMART and Jim Clark Auto World will be two of the three business card sponsors, so need one more.

Run for the Wall: Counts of the number of bikes at the fuel stop varied slightly, but we paid for 378 bikes for tolls.

District Elections: Voting for Representative and Secretary was held today at the meeting at Steve and Jeanie's. It was reported that Chris Butts has bowed out of the contest for District 4 Representative, but he is still on the ballot so can be voted for if members wish to. 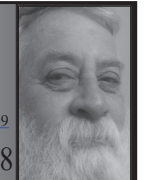

Protecting Your Rights in our Nation's Capital



June 6, 2018 Call To Action on Ethanol. As the battle on ethanol continues our President would agree to allow 15% ethanol fuels year around (EPA currently bans E15 sales in the summer months due to smog concerns) this will be in the change for decreased regulatory burdens on oil refineries. The EPA would allow exported ethanol fuel to be counted towards the required quota of ethanol mandated by the EPA.

Motorcyclists are concerned about using E15 in their motorcycles because not only does it violate their warranty but it is also illegal to use E15 in your motorcycle.

The Consumer Protection and Fuel Transparency Act, H.R. 5855 would expand consumer awareness on how to use fuels higher than 10% ethanol, including improved labeling, fuel pumps, safeguards, and education outreach. Motorcycles are specifically mentioned as concerned consumers and their need to have a strong dialogue directly with the EPA.

June 2nd 2018 the motorcycle Advisory convened.

Conducted online, presentations were delivered on topics including preliminary

results from the Motorcycle Crash Causation Study, potential infrastructures countermeasures for motorcycles and a reviews of different approaches to motorcycle safety via the State Highway Safety Plans. In this meeting like identifying "candidate roads" in different parts of the country where there are high levels of motorcycle crashes and considerations of adding infrastructure countermeasures to determine their effectiveness. They are looking at an alternative barrier designs that would be motorcycle friendly. A subgroup also formed to further look into friction surface issues such as "tar Snakes, slick pavement markings, grass clippings, ect, and how to measure the impact.

On Sunday May 13, 2018 Robin and I had car trouble near Indianapolis Indiana on our way to Bikers Inside The Beltway. By the time we got going again we were not able to attend so we headed back to Indianapolis where I stayed a couple days with Mike "Smokebomb" Marine from ABATE of Indiana. Mike and his wife opened up their home and he arranged me a ride with other ABATE of Indiana members

to the bus station where I hopped on a greyhound and back home. I would like to thank all the good people from ABATE of Indiana for their help and look forward to party with Smokebomb at Lake Perry.

The Meeting Of The Minds is coming up on September 20-23 in Denver Colorado. If you are going to attend let me know. So far Sis and I are going and hope to see you there.

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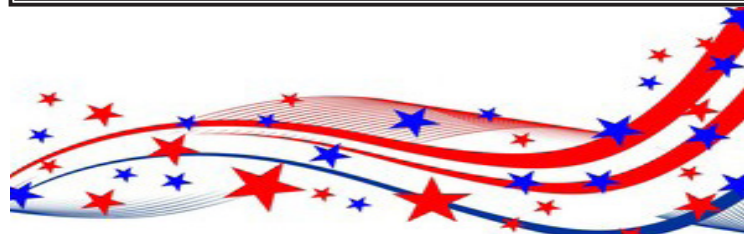
