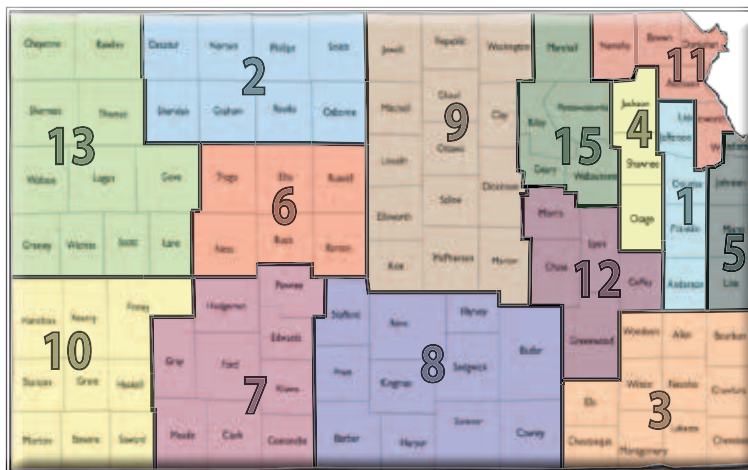

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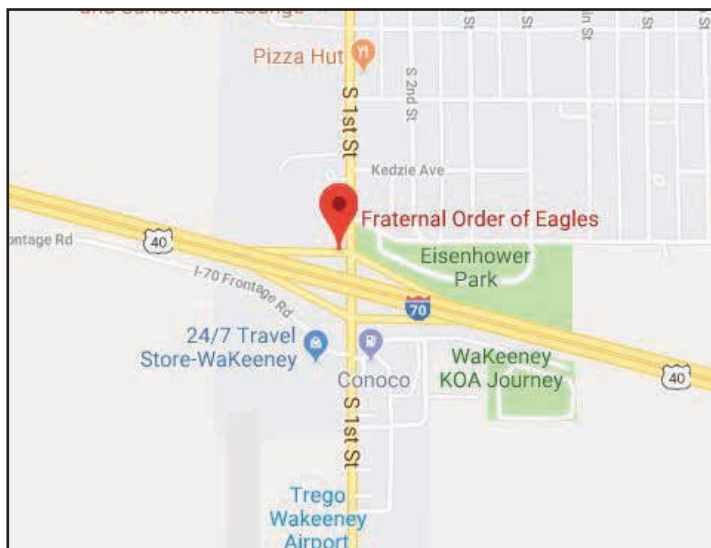

Lobbyist Report

Sine Die at the Capitol was on May 29th, after a short (4 days) veto session on the first of May. The House had passed a Medicaid Expansion bill, but the Senate failed to approve it by a single vote, despite Senator Hensley's work to get it on the floor. The hope is that there will be work done between now and the 2020 session so that it will be on the floor of both chambers next year. The Governor signed a budget bill in May, with a few line-item vetoes, most of which was overturned at the end of the session. Governor Kelly also signed a youth suicide prevention bill and a bill that would ensure privacy for National Guard personnel who seek mental health treatment. She also vetoed a tax relief bill that would basically have only benefited the wealthy and big corporations. The downside of that veto was that there was a clause to reduce sales taxes on food. The tax bill was not overturned. Hopefully, that will be addressed in the next session. Also for the 2020 Kansas legislative session, we hope to resurrect HB2088, the negligent driving bill, which was passed by the House Committee on Transportation, and was referred to the full House, but was never heard by the full chamber.

At the federal level, the drama continues. The Mueller investigation, the attorney general's interpretation of it, testimony in Congress, talk of impeaching the President, the possible war in Iran, issues with China, stalled talks with North Korea, tariffs, and so on. Tariffs are not good for any of us, as increased costs of products will simply be passed on to consumers. Plus, farmers in Kansas and other mid-west states are impacted by reduced sales of crops, hogs, and more. One cannot keep track of it all, even if you are news

junkie like I've become.

Get ready for the 2020 elections. Over 20 Democrats have thrown their hat into the ring to run for the presidential nomination, so lobbying by them has already begun. In Kansas Senator Pat Roberts has announced that he will not run for office again, so the battle for that position will be on the forefront here. Elections for Kansas Senator and House positions will also be in 2020, so pretty much every position is up for grabs. Please attend any town hall meetings put on by candidates in your area so you can ask questions about their position on topics.

As reported previously, the Congressional Senate has passed a resolution regarding motorcycle profiling. Work is being done on the House side to get them to pass a similar resolution.

As always, I encourage our members to join the AMA and the MRF to have information on the current state of affairs in Washington, as well as state news. Perhaps most important, the dues we pay support those efforts. Without funding the AMA and MRF cannot continue to support motorcycle rights and related issues. You can also get on their websites to sign up for email notifications.

As always, if you have personal contacts with your elected officials and can help connect me with them it would be appreciated. Personal relationships go a long way in pretty much every endeavor, be it work, personal, or legislative in nature. Anything you can do to connect me with your local legislator would be greatly appreciated.

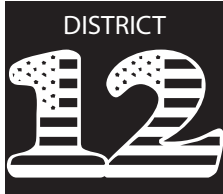

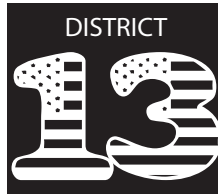

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I wear a helmet and be a member?

Yes, ABATE strives to ensure all motorcyclists reserve the right to choose to wear a helmet or not. ABATE's stance is not Anti-Helmet, but rather Anti-Helmet Law. The factors of helmet use are too complex for a simple statistic, so ABATE believes, before government law needlessly endanger lives, that such a decision should be left to the rider, and pursue other venues of motorcycle safety--primarily education and awareness.

Do I need to be a Harley owner?

No, ABATE is an advocate for the rights of all motorcyclists, regardless of what or where they ride.

Do I need to own a motorcycle?

No, ABATE consists of all advocates of motorcyclists and motorcycling. The rights of which may be supported by anyone who cares, and are welcome to do so.

Do I have to live in Kansas?

No, ABATE of Kansas has many non-Kansas-resident members who still ride in Kansas. ABATE of Kansas does not believe the rights of motorcyclists stop at the state borderline. ABATE of Kansas works with other state and national Motorcycle Rights Organizations (MROs) to preserve rights wherever the road leads.

Is ABATE a motorcycle club?

No, ABATE of Kansas is classified as a lobbying organization.

Which District can I belong to?

You can belong to any district you prefer. Districts are divided by county groups, except District 20 which is mostly out-of-state members, however also choose

districts adjacent to their state, if preferred. You may choose any district based on where you work, live, or have social ties. The only restriction is that you can only belong to one district at a time.

Why did I stop getting a newsletter?

Chances are most likely you have either moved or your membership has expired. Please check with your district or the ABATE of Kansas State office. It may also be you are not listed with your local post office. Please check with them to make sure you are listed at that address.

Do I need my ABATE card?

Yes, keep your membership card with you when you can. At events, it's faster and more reliable than roster checking. Also, many of your stops may give discounts for ABATE members.

Is ABATE just about helmets?

No, ABATE monitors all bills, laws, and regs that impact motorcycling, including manufacturing, operation, environment and education.

Do I need a permit to camp on leased area at Lake Perry?

Yes, permits are required by the Corp of Engineers which are requested and obtained from the ABATE of Kansas State office in Perry, the only exception being if you plan to camp during the Labor Day Rally event.

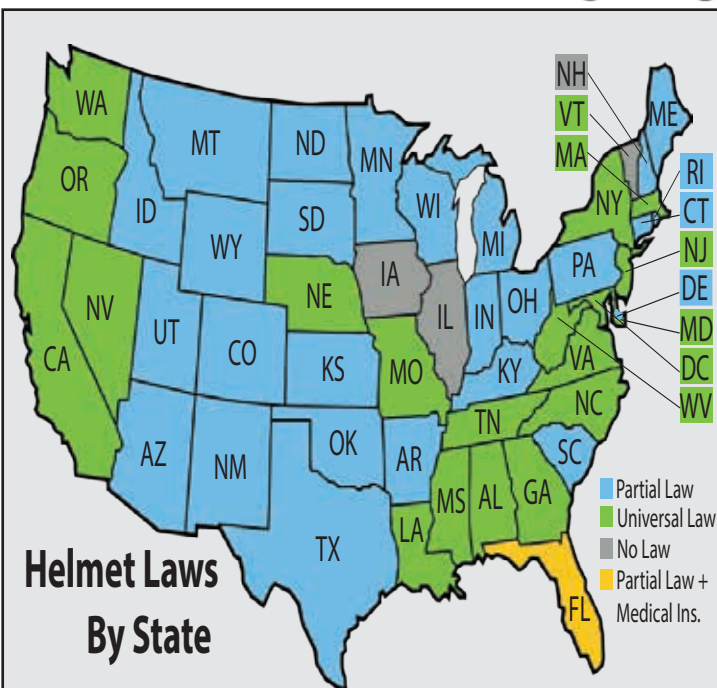

The MRF and Bikers Inside the Beltway started paying off in less than two weeks.

Seventeen Congressional Offices have signed on as co-sponsors to House Resolution 255, the Anti-Motorcyclist Profiling Resolution. There are now 40 co-sponsors since the Resolution was introduced at the end of March. The MRF has surpassed the 38 co-sponsors garnered in the 18 months the MRF worked on an earlier Anti-Profiling Resolution during the 115th Congress.

The membership dues for the MRF have now increased for individual membership, it went from \$30 to \$35. For joint membership, from \$50 to \$60. Three-year individual membership went from \$80 to \$95 and three-year joint membership from \$130 to \$140. This is still an exceedingly small price to pay to help protect your freedom as a motorcyclist.

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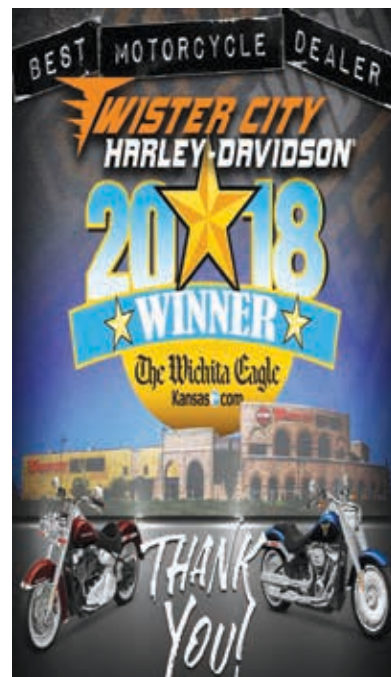
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
