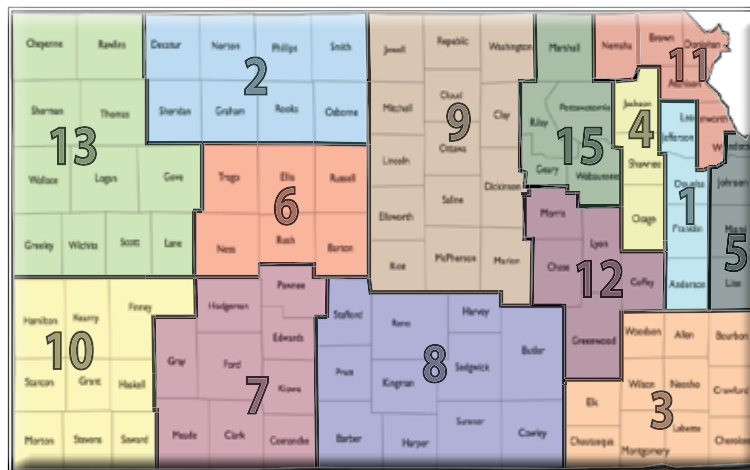

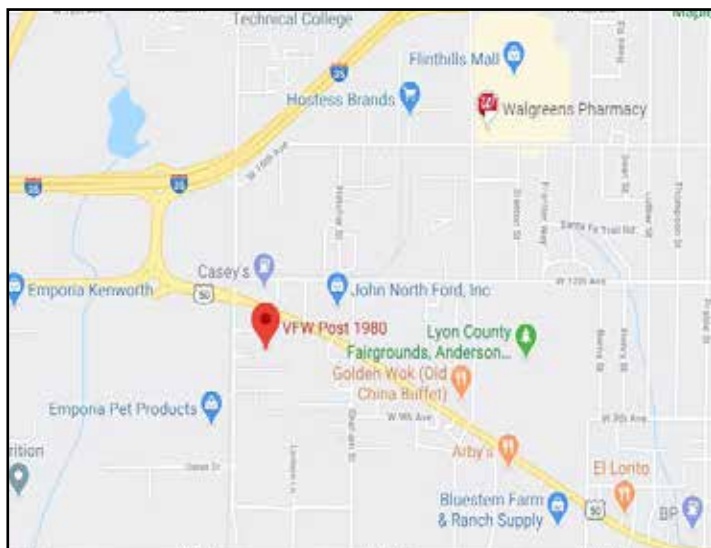

Jack called the meeting to order at 1:15 pm. There were 14 members and 4 guests present. The Pledge of Allegiance was cited, followed by a moment of silence for lost brothers and sisters, our military, first responders, and for the Swoyer family. Paul's older brother died a couple of weeks ago.

Secretary's Report: While we did not meet in April or May, reports were written and were in the newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: MRF Sustaining Membership is past due. We're not sure if it was paid last year or not, as the expiration date on the letter from MRF said that it expired in March of 2019, but in any case, we need to renew the membership. Jack paid for 2 months' fees for the D4 storage unit this week. Jack did not have the statements from our Treasurer but texted them to Steve later. The Savings Account for RFTW is over half of what we'll need for next year, and the District Checking account balance is stable.

State Report: The April State Board meeting was canceled, but the May meeting was held at the State Office in Perry. The minutes are in the June newsletter. District 5 painted the office in Perry on the first of May. It looks 100% better, thank you, D5. Yesterday's meeting was held in Oakley, and Jack did attend. He did not bring his notes, so no report. Byron reported on the discussion that was had with the Corps about having

a bluegrass festival in June at the Perry site next year. The discount on memberships in May resulted in about 115 new or renewed members. Byron was nominated for president and abstained, Jon Puckett accepted. Secretary nominations were Amber Shutts and Rick Gitchel for Sergeant at Arms.

SMART Report: Like so many organizations, when the COVID-19 shutdowns occurred, we lost access to the school so canceled 8 classes that would have been scheduled in April and May. We will again be teaching the 2WBRC and 3WBRC classes, starting with a 2W class on the week-end of June 19-21.

AMA/MRF Report: Please read Coop's report in the newsletter. When I received the May/June American Biker's Journal (the MRF newsletter), I learned that it would be the last printed version of the newsletter in the foreseeable future. Like ABATE of Kansas and other motorcycle rights organizations, the MRF is adjusting their business model to adapt to decreased revenue. Biker's on The Beltway has also been canceled this year.

Old Business: 2020 Bike Show: Do we or don't we was the question at the March meeting. The consensus was that we should have a show in September, but no one has responded to requests for volunteers for a planning committee. Chris B. said he had a connection with the Wood Shed and they might be willing to be a

venue for the bike show, but we can also do it at Post 400 again. No one offered to assist with planning.

Motorcycle Awareness Month was in May. Our Lobbyist, Tony Railsback, had submitted a request for a proclamation signing by the Governor, but with COVID-19 it did not happen.

Run for The Wall was canceled this year. A group of Legion Riders and CVMA learned of a group of riders coming through Topeka on May 18th so we had a flag line on the Wanamaker Bridge over I-70. We counted 26 riders, and a collection was taken to pay for the fuel at the station on the turnpike. Toll fees were also paid by donations. Field Events Discussion: We talked about food vendors and we got the ABATE trailer orga-

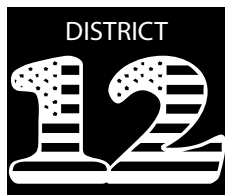

The MRF had to cancel Bikers Inside the Beltway due to the COVID 19.

The MRF is focusing on the 38th Annual Meeting of the Minds Conference to be held in Indianapolis Indiana on September 24th-27th, 2020. Make your reservations now.

Bikers Blues and Barbecue in Fayetteville Arkansas has been canceled so all you riders that missed out on that that do not forget that the 45th Annual National Labor Day Rally is still on. You can practice social distancing there. Our beverage slingers can toss a brew 6 feet without making much foam. They are Professionals, just ask them.

The FAST-ACT of 2015 will expire in September 2020. The contacts in the U.S. Senate alerted the MRF regarding a proposed change to the dedicated 405 Motorcycle Safety Funds in the National Priority

Safety Programs that is authorized through the Highway Bill. This change would add another criteria for states to qualify for motorcycle safety funds. To qualify, the states must meet two of the six current criteria.

The additional qualifying area would have a category for states that have a mandatory helmet law for anyone under the age of 18. While meeting the under 18 helmet law is not mandatory to receive these funds, the MRF opposes any such change. The MRF is adamantly opposed to any federal law that would require the use of a helmet, apparel, or conspicuity standard.

In 1975, Congress enacted a law forcing all states to enact a mandatory helmet law to receive any federal funding. The MRF and state motorcycle rights organizations fought tirelessly to get this law overturned.

Congress flip-flopped on the helmet law by striking down the 1975 law, then reinstating it in 1991. The MRF and the motorcycle rights organizations succeeded in 1995 by overturning the Federal Mandatory Helmet Law.

Remember to look twice save a life the life you save will probably be your own.
