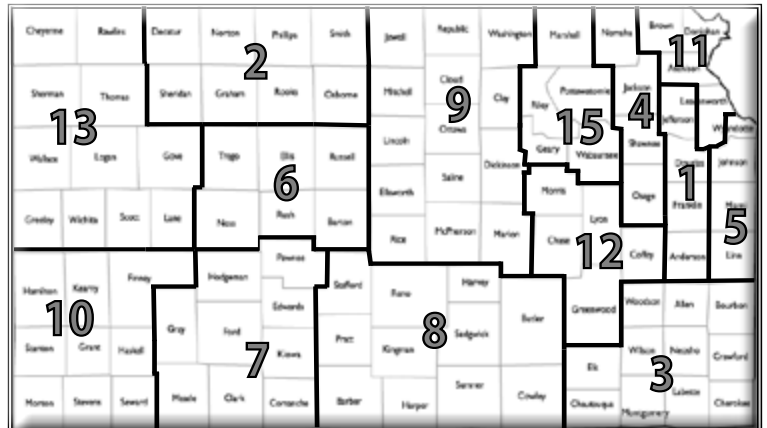

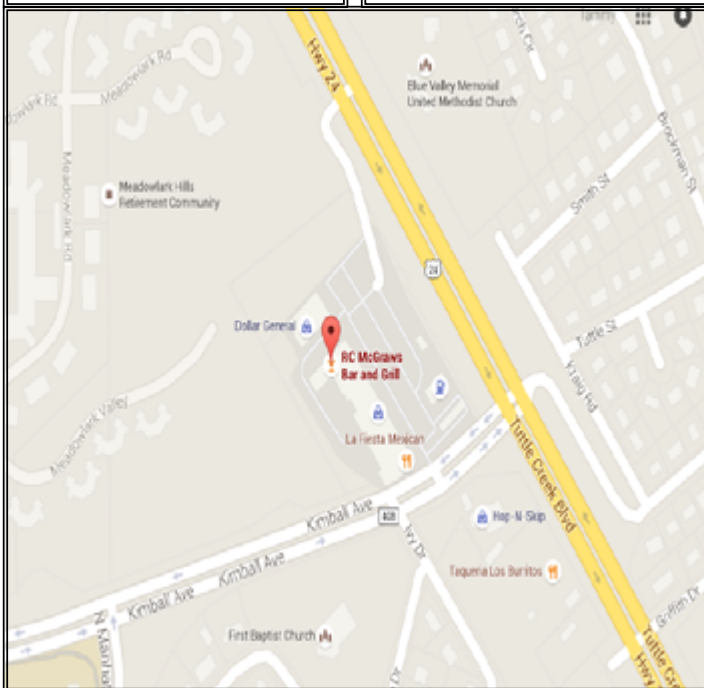

State Meeting

Meeting called to order @ 12:02 pm

Pledge of Allegiance

Moment of silence

Roll call- All present except dist 6 & 13. Carey for treasurer, Bill S for dist 1, Sarah for dist 15.

Secretary report- Motion was made by Bill S (2nd by Doc) to wave reading of the minutes. Motion passed by a show of hands.

Treasurer Report- Carey reviewed the report that was in the packet. Tammy asked if the EZ web hosting had been removed & was told it was & to check to see if they would remove the charge. Byron asked if the deposit made was for band sponsorships & was told that it was. Sis asked what the charge was to Dodge House & was told that it was for issues at the hotel. Carey stated that the new membership apps are in the packet. Please throw out all blue membership applications.

Old Business- Paul stated that the CDs had all been consolidated into 2 now. The larger cd is on a 5yr term & the other is on a 1yr term. 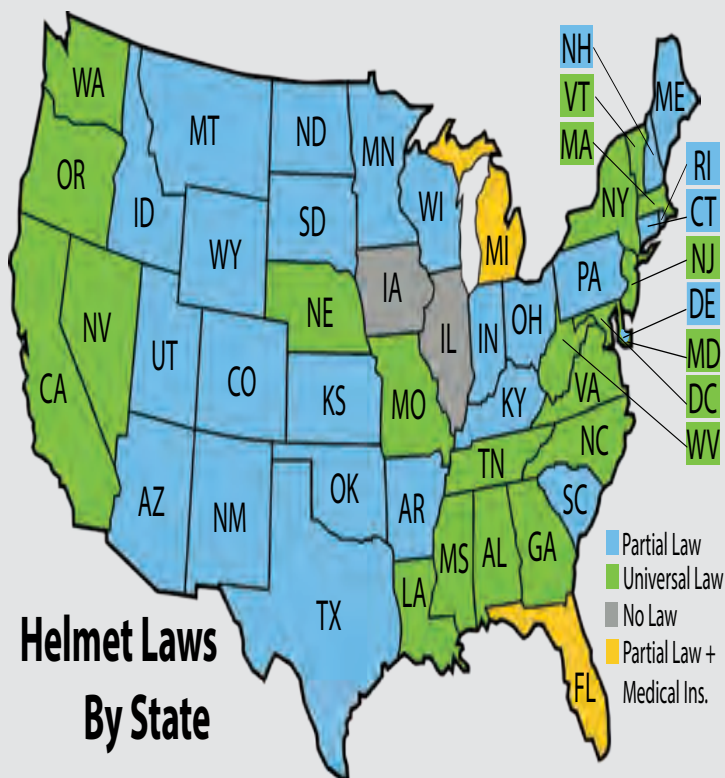

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I wear a helmet and be a member?

Yes, ABATE strives to ensure all motorcyclists reserve the right to choose to wear a helmet or not. ABATE's stance is not Anti-Helmet, but rather Anti-Helmet Law. The factors of helmet use are too complex for a simple statistic, so ABATE believes, before government law needlessly endanger lives, that such a decision should be left to the rider, and pursue other venues of motorcycle safety--primarily education and awareness.

Do I need to be a Harley owner?

No, ABATE is an advocate for the rights of all motorcyclists, regardless of what or where they ride.

Do I need to own a motorcycle?

No, ABATE consists of all advocates of motorcyclists and motorcycling. The rights of which may be supported by anyone who cares, and are welcome to do so.

Do I have to live in Kansas?

No, ABATE of Kansas has many non-Kansas-resident members who still ride in Kansas. ABATE of Kansas does not believe the rights of motorcyclists stop at the state borderline. ABATE of Kansas works with other state and national Motorcycle Rights Organizations (MROs) to preserve rights wherever the road leads.

Is ABATE a motorcycle club?

No, ABATE of Kansas is classified as a lobbying organization.

Which District can I belong to?

You can belong to any district you prefer. Districts are divided by county groups, except District 20 which is mostly out-of-state members, however also choose districts adjacent to their state, if preferred. You may choose any district based on where you work, live, or have social ties. The only restriction is that you can only belong to one district at a time.

Why did I stop getting a newsletter?

Chances are most likely you have either moved or your membership has expired. Please check with your district or the ABATE of Kansas State office. It may also be you are not listed with your local post office. Please check with them to make sure you are listed at that address.

Do I need my ABATE card?

Yes, keep your membership card with you when you can. At events, it's faster and more reliable than roster checking. Also, many of your stops may give discounts for ABATE members.

Is ABATE just about helmets?

No, ABATE monitors all bills, laws, and regs that impact motorcycling, including manufacturing, operation, environment and education.

Do I need a permit to camp on leased area at Lake Perry?

Yes, permits are required by the Corp of Engineers which are requested and obtained from the ABATE of Kansas State office in Perry, the only exception being if you plan to camp during the Labor Day Rally event.

LOBBYIST REPORT

As of April 7, there were 420 bills submitted on the House side and 247 on the Senate side. The Legislature adjourned for their spring break on April 7 and reconvened on May 1st, which is the veto session. Prior to the break both chambers passed the rescission bill, HB2052, which is supposed to fix this year's budget shortfall, which went to the Governor who signed it on April 18. This should produce a positive ending balance for the current fiscal year that ends June 30th. The Senate and House returned on May 1st and the main focus has been on creating a tax bill, a budget bill, and an education financing formula. The governor vetoed the first budget bill that both houses passed, but the Senate could not get enough votes to override it. As of May 5th the legislature has yet to come to any agreement on any of these three issues. They will take off May 6 and 7 and return on the 8th to resume the discussion.

Bills that could/will affect ABATE members:

SB-99 and HB-2010: Prohibiting the operation of a motor vehicle while using wireless communication device. Neither Transportation Committee acted on this. Texting is already illegal, and this would have extended that to cell phone use unless hands free technology is being used. Apparently did not get any traction.

HB-2104: Would have increased the minimum vehicle insurance requirements from \$25K to \$50K for one person injuries and from \$50K to \$100K for two persons. This would have, no doubt,

increased insurance premiums, however it was not acted on in either chamber.

HB-2152: Would have allowed hemp treatment for certain medical conditions. The Committee on Health and Human Services heard the bill on March 15 but took no action on it.

HB-2174, regarding disabled veteran/disabled persons license plates was heard and approved in the Committee on Veterans. With amendments it passed the House and the Senate and was signed into law by the Governor on April 12th.

HB-2188, the right of way bill, was never worked by the House Transportation Committee, despite written testimony and testimony at the hearing from myself and by many of our ABATE members (thank you Robin, District 11, for your very moving testimony). Consequently it is dead this year so we'll have to do some legwork to get it re-submitted next year.

HB-2194, regarding motorcycle licensing and fees, impacting rider education programs and reciprocal recognition of training certificates from other states. It was worked by the House Committee on Transportation on March 15th and was approved by the full House on a 122 to 0 vote on March 27th. It was sent to the Senate Committee on Transportation on March 28th. Unfortunately, with the time it took for the amendments to be made it was so late in the session that the Senate Transportation committee never met about it, so now it will be pushed off to 2018.

HB-2202, Drivers' licenses

renewal period, test fees. This bill would have extended licensing periods from 6 to 8 years except for those 65 and older, which would have been 4 years. Renewal fees would have increased from \$18 to \$27 for those under 65. This bill was never worked by the House Committee on Transportation. SB 13, the so-called "UnCork Kansas" bill that will start April 1, 2019, and allow convenience and grocery stores to sell 6% strong beer rather than 3.2% cereal malt beverage beer. The measure also will allow liquor stores—now the only place to buy that strong beer—to sell nonalcoholic products for up to 20% of their revenue. It passed both chambers and was signed into law by the Governor.

Concealed Carry: Much discussion and several bills submitted, although none acted upon. There is a slight chance in the veto session that an extension prohibiting firearms at state public hospitals, and mental health centers might arise again, but nothing beyond that to include universities and

even government offices. It would take millions of dollars to hire security and install metal detectors at entrances of all these facilities.

Proclamation for Motorcycle Awareness Month signing: Several ABATE members, KSTRO and KDOT staff, and other motorcyclists met at the Governor's Office for on April 27th for the proclamation signing. Pictures were taken with the Governor in his office, as well as outside the Capitol, and should be in the newsletter.

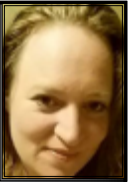

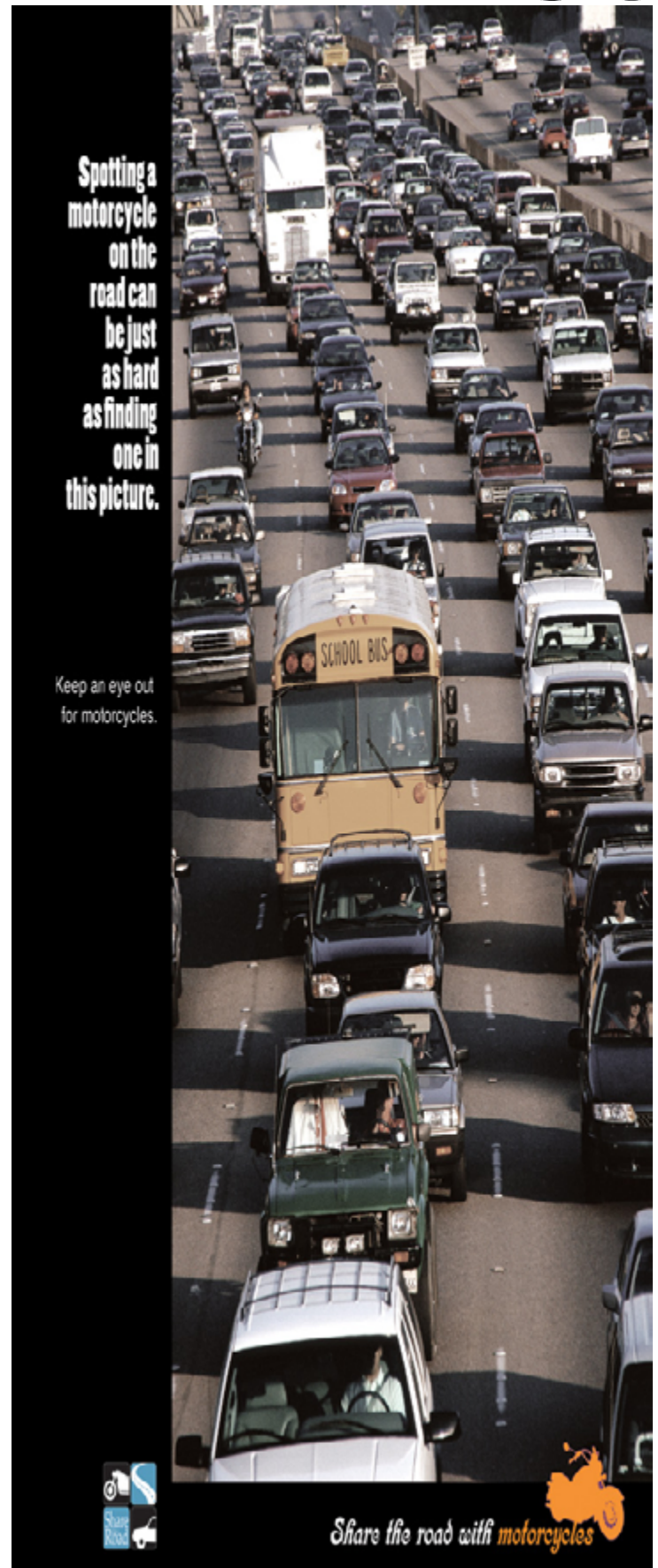

ABATE OF KANSAS 42ND ANNUAL NATIONAL LABOR DAY RALLY



The Reverend Horton Heat is perhaps the most popular psychobilly artist of all time, his recognition only rivaled by the esteem generated by the genre's founders, the Cramps. The Reverend (as both the three-man band and its guitar-playing frontman were known) built a strong cult following during the '90s through constant touring, manic showmanship, and a twisted sense of humor. The latter was nothing new in the world of psychobilly, of course, and Heat's music certainly kept the trashy aesthetic of his spiritual forebears. The Reverend's true innovation was updating the psychobilly sound for the alternative rock era. In his hands, it was something more than retro-obsessed kitsch -- it had roaring distorted guitars, it rocked as hard as any punk band, and it didn't look exclusively to pop culture

of the past for its style or subject matter. Most of the Reverend's lyrics were gonzo celebrations of sex, drugs, booze, and cars, and true to his name, his concerts often featured mock sermons in the style of a rural revivalist preacher. The band's initial recordings were released by that bastion of indie credibility, Sub Pop, at the height of the grunge craze; after a spell on the major label Interscope, the Reverend Horton Heat returned to the independent world, still a highly profitable draw on the concert circuit.



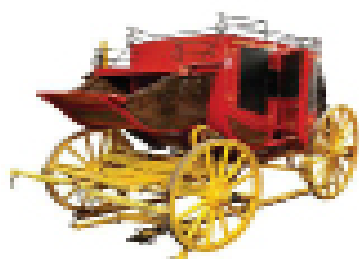

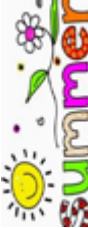

Protecting Your Rights in our Nation's Capital

May 4th 2017 the House of Representatives and the Senate introduced a bipartisan and bicarmel measure that addresses concerns over motorcycle profiling.

Leading this effort are Senators Johnson (R-Wis) and Shaheen (D-NH) in the senate and in the house, Representatives Walberg (R-Mich) and Pocan (D-Wis). Notably this Bill is both bicarmel and bipartisan. It demonstrates the importance of this issue and shows that it is an issue that effects everyone not just Republicans or Democrats.

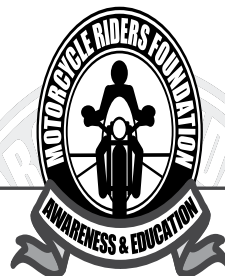
This will look similar to what was introduced last summer; it will define the practice of profiling, promote public awareness of motorcycle profiling and encourage collaboration and communication between law enforcement and the motorcycle community. Further, it urges state law enforcement officials to condemn motorcycle profiling in written policies and training materials. Though the bills are resolutions they send a strong message on the issue that affects so many riders.

Thanks to the motorcycle profiling project for their support in supplying the MRF with data to convince our federal lawmakers that change is needed, as well as our MRF members and supporters and the Motorcycle Profiling Working Group that helped get it this far. On Tuesday, May 23, 2017 the Motorcycle Riders Foundation will present Bikers Inside the Beltway in Washington D.C.. Our group from ABATE of Kansas is

planning to attend. We hope to bring back information to share about our experiences with our legislators. This is my first trip to Washington, D.C. and am looking forward to it. As it warms up, more motorcycles are hitting the road so be careful out there. Remember, look twice save a life the life you save will probably be your own.

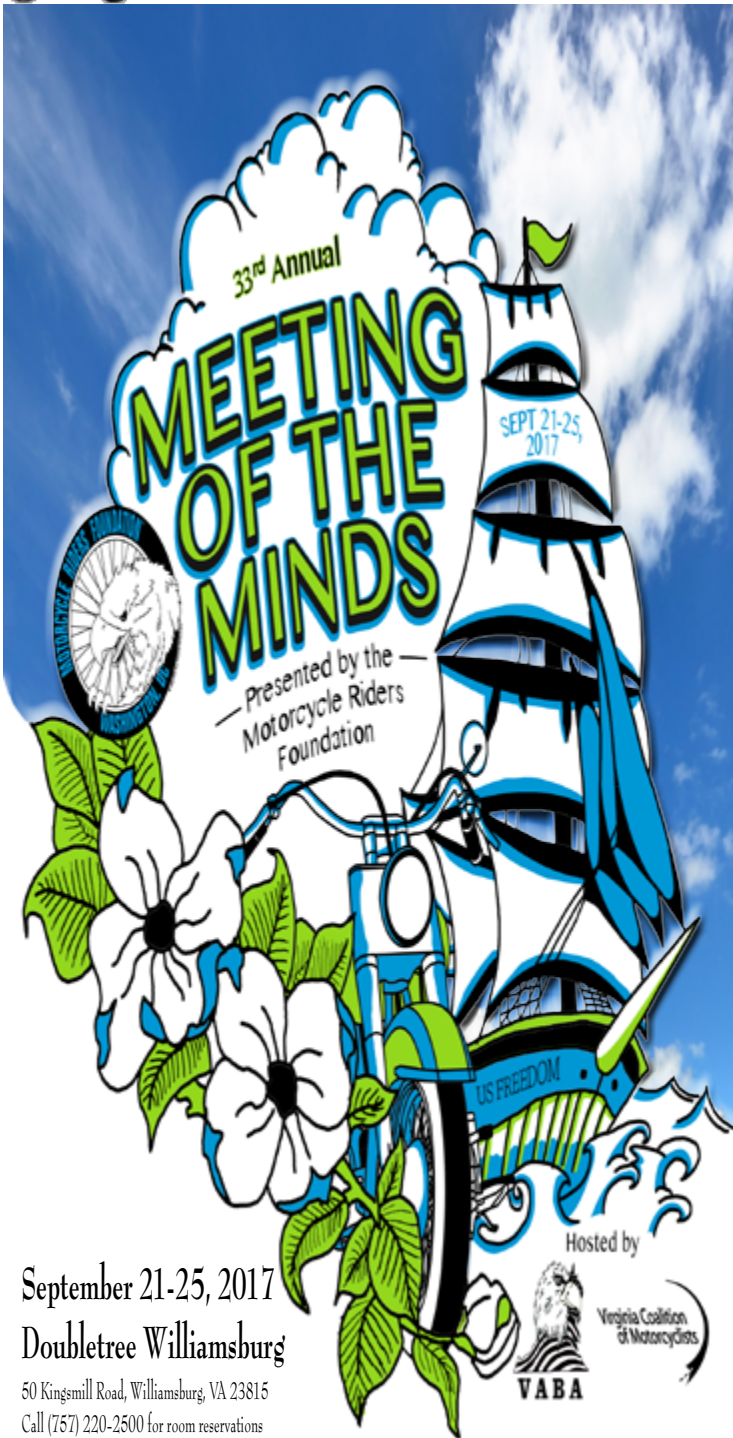
