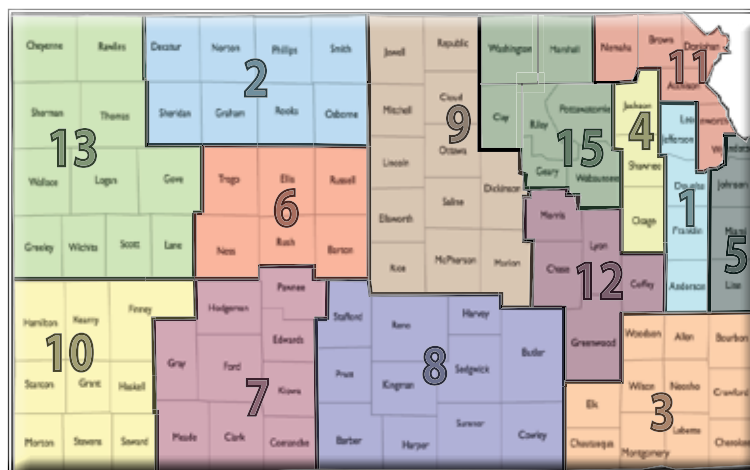

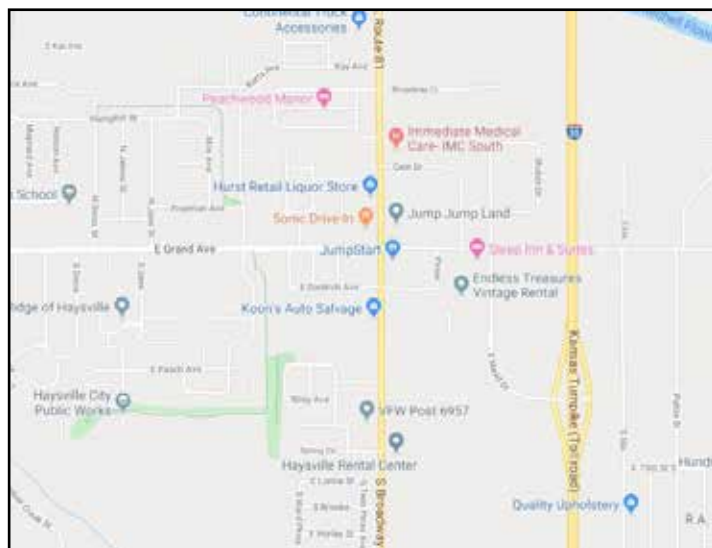

Meeting called to order at 12:03 pm.

Pledge of Allegiance.

Moment of Silence.

Roll Call- all present except District 2, 6, 11, and 13. Mike for District 3.

Guest speaker - Tammy introduced Matt Bretz with Bretz & Young law firm. ABATE VP Tony and Corp-Sec Tammy met with Matt in January and discussed having an ABATE lawyer referral program. ABATE of Kansas, Inc., is a Kansas not-for-profit corporation and may receive referral fees if it sets up a lawyer referral program. The motion was made by Tony RR (second by Tony R D15) to move forward with the referral program. Motion passed with all board members voting yes.

Secretary report- Amber went over highlights from the report. The motion was made by Tony R D15 (second by Tony RR) to approve the report. Motion

passed by a show of hands.

Financial report- Lori asked that the District fill out both reports in the packet and send them in. Lori asked that all districts get in their sales tax and newsletter payments into the state. A.B.A.T.E. Lawyer Referral Service

At the State BOD meeting on February 13, 2021, the board voted unanimously to start a Lawyer Referral Service. Lawyers participating in the A.B.A.T.E. of Kansas Lawyer Referral Service will pay 10% of their fees from any injury claim to A.B.A.T.E. of Kansas in turn, referral fees received by the A.B.A.T.E. of Kansas Lawyer Referral Service will be used to fund the Mission of the organization.

While the goal is to always keep two wheels down, we all have experienced other motorists not keeping a lookout for motorcycles, turning in front of us, or driving while distracted. The Referral Service will ensure that attorneys participating in the program support the Mission of A.B.A.T.E. of Kansas, are motorcycle riders who are highly experienced in representing motorcyclists in Kansas, and understand the unique legal and insurance issues surrounding motorcyclists.

All injury claims - motorcycle, car, truck, semi, dangerous product, dangerous premises, etc. - qualify for the service. Additionally, in an effort to make sure that members have adequate insurance, lawyers participating in the referral service will be available to review insurance policies and coverages on members' policies at no cost.

Notice of Proposed Amendments to Policies and Procedures

III. Content:

A. Required content on district websites includes a current district board roster including contact information, an events calendar, a link to www.abateks.org, a graphic including the ABATE of Kansas state seal.

B. District Board officer's personal information should be limited to name and e-mail address, (or phone number), if it is the officer's preference and there is no other option, which may be substituted with a district-offered email address (or phone number), if available.

C. Content from sources outside of ABATE of Kansas, Inc., must be in conformance with ABATE of Kansas policies and United States Code, Title 17.

D. Official meeting minutes release is approved by the Corporate Secretary before printed in the newsletter. Only the official release can be used as content for a website.

E. Ethnic slurs, religious slurs, sexual slurs and/or slang, and profane expletives are disallowed in any publication of ABATE of Kansas, including websites. In addition, mentions of specific

monetary values, except admission prices listed on fliers, alcoholic beverages, or any use of the term "rodeo" are prohibited from publication.

F. Only ABATE merchandise may be listed on websites. Pricing, sizing and color options will be omitted, and a contact e-mail or phone number will be listed.

Proposed change:

F. Only ABATE of Kansas merchandise may be listed on any platforms. Districts are responsible for building and maintaining their own online stores. Returns Policy: Consumers have 30 calendar days to return an item from the date they received it. To be eligible for a return, the item must be unused and in the same condition that it was received in. Items must be in the original packaging. Item needs to have the receipt or proof of purchase. Refunds: Once we receive an item, we will inspect it and notify the consumer that we have received the returned item. We will immediately notify consumers of the status of refund after inspecting the item. If return is approved, we will initiate and send a replacement product, or receive a store credit within seven days. Shipping: Consumers will be responsible for paying for shipping costs for returning items. Shipping costs are nonrefundable. (proposed amendment Feb 2021)



I hope all of you have been keeping warm in what seems to be a never-ending winter. The good news is in a few weeks we will be heading into another riding season. That will bring the chance to ride to district meetings and events.

A few of our districts are struggling with decreased memberships and participation. It seems we always look in the same places for solutions to this problem. Remember every district is made up of several counties. We need our members in all counties across the state to reach into their circles for potential new members. If we search for new people and tap different resources, we may get new ideas to build our organization and make more people interested in joining.

Contact your district members, ask them to attend a meeting or an event, and bring a friend or two (or ten). They could be your next board member. The more members we have from across the spectrum the more effective we will be at pursuing our goal of protecting the rights of all riders across the state.

Lobbyist Report

As your state lobbyist, I am going to start this out on a negative note, talking with my house rep. he commented that there had been over 1100 new bills introduced this year already and that does not include any bills from last year that are still active. He said that probably 1/2 to 1% of these will go anywhere. The priority for the legislature will be focused on Medicaid Expansion, Medical Marijuana, COVID-19, and the Kansas Economy.

Moving on.

#1 Distracted Driving SB 113 - This is the senate version of the hands free bill that passed House Transportation last year before COVID-19 hit. It was moved to the senate ways and means. It needed to go from ways and means to senate transportation. The only one that can move it

to ways and means to transportation is Senator Peterson who is the head of senate transportation. In a brief visit with Senator Peterson in person, he implied that he was not going to move SB 113 into Transportation for a hearing. He asked that we support SB 25. SB 25 is a hands-free driving bill that makes it illegal to use a cell phone in a work zone, an active school zone, and for anyone under 18. Senator Peterson said if we can get this to pass into law then we can try to add or change it. Senator Peterson said this would be easier to do. Senator Peterson has been an advocate for hands-free for many years. His comment to me was we will have to learn to walk before we run.

#2 The Profiling Bill is still in the revisor stage. After a person to person visit with Senator

Clayey who has taken this on, along with Senator Kloos has said that Kansas already has a Profiling Statute. They both have implied that we did not have enough language to work with. Their thoughts are we try and put our language into the existing statute KS 22-406 thru KS 22-411. It would then have to go through the legislative process but would be easier to pass into the existing statute. After it comes out of the revisor it would have to go to Senate Transportation.

Both Senator Clayey and Senator Kloos sit on the Senate Transportation committee.

#3 Is the Vulnerable Road User HB 2337. This replaces the right of way bill that died last year in the House Transportation Committee. This bill has a much broader form to it. This would protect Motorcyclists, Bicyclists, Pedestrians, Skate Boarders, Emergency Vehicles, Law Enforcement, KDOT, and

Transportation by Farm Animals. Representative Probst introduced this bill for us and said he has a good feeling about this. The next step is to get it to the House Transportation Committee for a hearing. Before we try and make this happen, we as ABATE members need to get people on board to testify from as many of these different road users as possible. Anyone that can help me with this please feel free to call me (620) 204-8018. If I do not answer, please leave me a voicemail.

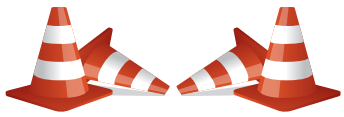
#4 There are some little bills we are watching that pertain to motorcyclists.

On February 7th, 2021, ABATE of Kansas District 5 monthly meeting started at noon at Red Eye.

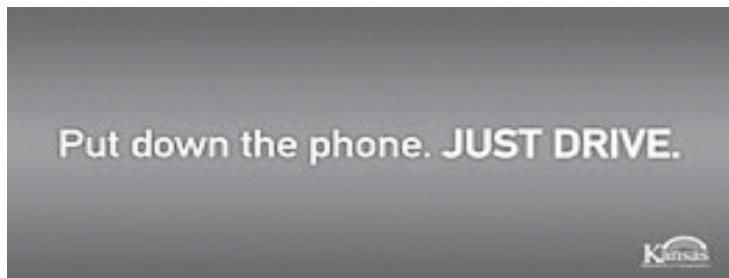
Due to weather, the meeting was kept short and informal. Not much was talked about. We will talk about more at the March meeting.

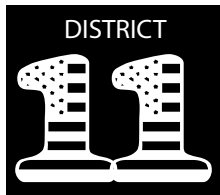

Fatalities resulting from a collision with a deer are an emerging trend within the last decade. During 2002-2012, 48 motorcyclists have been killed in a crash with a deer, nearly five times more than the 10 deaths between 1991-2001. 2013 is on pace to be the deadliest year with rider deer crashes.

Habitat and range

White-tailed deer live in prairies, forests, swamps, wood lots and agricultural fields. They are common in both suburban and rural areas. Deer become a traffic hazard when crossing highways.

Reproduction

White-tailed deer mate from November to early December. Their young (often two fawns, weighing eight pounds each) are born seven months later. During the mating season, male deer (bucks) travel widely in search of females (does). It is at this time they become a real hazard on roadways.

Safety Tips:

Deer are unpredictable, it is important for riders to be alert and focused on riding. Also wear full protective gear, including a DOT-approved helmet.



When encountering an animal slow down and use both brakes to stop. If a larger animal, like a deer, jumps out in front of you, use emergency braking (applying both front and rear brakes) to stop as quickly as possible. If you are unable to stop in time and/or contact is imminent after maximum braking, and you have room in the lane, release the brakes and attempt to swerve slowly behind the animal.

Rider training is an affordable, potentially life-saving option. Training is important for beginning, as well as experienced riders, to sharpen skills and improve crash-avoidance techniques.

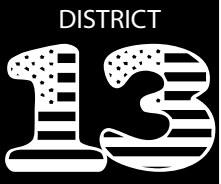

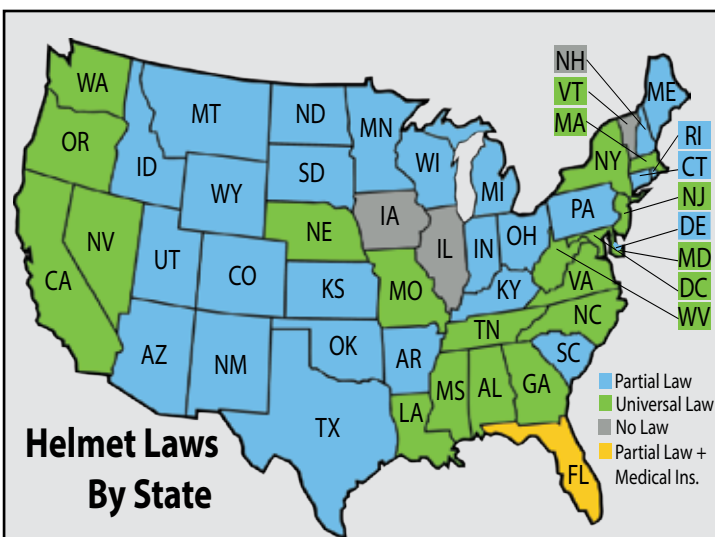

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I wear a helmet and be a member?

Yes, ABATE strives to ensure all motorcyclists reserve the right to choose to wear a helmet or not. ABATE's stance is not Anti-Helmet, but rather Anti-Helmet Law. The factors of helmet use are too complex for a simple statistic, so ABATE believes, before government law needlessly endanger lives, that such a decision should be left to the rider, and pursue other venues of motorcycle safety--primarily education and awareness.

Do I need to be a Harley owner?

No, ABATE is an advocate for the rights of all motorcyclists, regardless of what or where they ride.

Do I need to own a motorcycle?

No, ABATE consists of all advocates of motorcyclists and motorcycling. The rights of which may be supported by anyone who cares, and are welcome to do so.

Do I have to live in Kansas?

No, ABATE of Kansas has many non-Kansas-resident members who still ride in Kansas. ABATE of Kansas does not believe the rights of motorcyclists stop at the state borderline. ABATE of Kansas works with other state and national Motorcycle Rights Organizations (MROs) to preserve rights wherever the road leads.

Is ABATE a motorcycle club?

No, ABATE of Kansas is classified as a lobbying organization.

Which District can I belong to?

You can belong to any district you prefer. Districts are divided by county groups, except District 20 which is mostly out-of-state

members, however also choose districts adjacent to their state, if preferred. You may choose any district based on where you work, live, or have social ties. The only restriction is that you can only belong to one district at a time.

Why did I stop getting a newsletter?

Chances are most likely you have either moved or your membership has expired. Please check with your district or the ABATE of Kansas State office. It may also be you are not listed with your local post office. Please check with them to make sure you are listed at that address.

Do I need my ABATE card?

Yes, keep your membership card with you when you can. At events, it's faster and more reliable than roster checking. Also, many of your stops may give discounts for ABATE members.

Is ABATE just about helmets?

No, ABATE monitors all bills, laws, and regs that impact motorcycling, including manufacturing, operation, environment and education.

Do I need a permit to camp on leased area at Lake Perry?

Yes, permits are required by the Corp of Engineers which are requested and obtained from the ABATE of Kansas State office in Perry, the only exception being if you plan to camp during the Labor Day Rally event.
