State Meeting

Meeting Called to Order @ 10:05am

Pledge of Allegiance

Moment of Silence- Please keep Tim Sparks & Dennis McDonald family in your thoughts with the loss of both men. Also keep Tim Farr in your thoughts with the loss of his father.

Roll Call- All present except for Dist 13.

Ringo stated that 3 applications were turned in & were in each packet for the Lobbyist position. Please review before the November meeting, where interviews will be held for the lobbyist. Ringo also appointed Bill C as the MRF rep. Thank you Bill

Secretary Report-Read by Amber S. Motion to approve as read made by Ringo (2nd by Jodi). Motion approved by show of hands.

Financial Report-Richard asked that a donation be made to the VFW for the use of their copier & office supplies. A motion was made by Lori S (2nd by Jack) to make a donation to the VFW. Motion passed with all board members voting yes. Richard went through the financials & stated that the lobbyist contract has been paid. Richard reminded everyone that the budget for the year is smaller & we would need to watch expenses. Richard stated that we needed to change it to reimbursing only 2 people to attend the Mile committee meetings. Lori S made a motion (2nd by Jodi) to reimburse 2 members to attend the yearly Mile committee meetings. Motion passed with all board members voting yes except dist 9, Secretary, Vice president voting no, & treasurer abstaining. Due to budget restraints, Richard suggested to have the board

finance their own way to the MidSouth Mile. A discussion was had & it was said that the Mile is a state event & we need to help our board attend the meeting. A motion was made by Ron V (2nd by Tony R) to reimburse 20 board members to go to the Mile for their gas (1 way) & 1 night lodging up to a pre-determined amount. No reimbursement will be made for the banquet fee. Motion passed with all board members voting yes except the treasurer who abstained. Tony R pointed out that the MidSouth Mile being a state event was in the 2013 policies & procedures but not in the 2016 copy. Everyone agreed that it needed to be corrected & put back in the policies & procedures. Sheri is working to bring bylaws and policies up to date. Byron reminded everyone that if you do attend the Mile to attend the seminars. Paul S stated that 2 checks have been received for the water damages at the office & van repairs. Richard thanked Ruth (Dist 11) for her help at the LDR with the finances. Richard then asked & appointed Lori H as the assistant treasurer. Thank you Lori

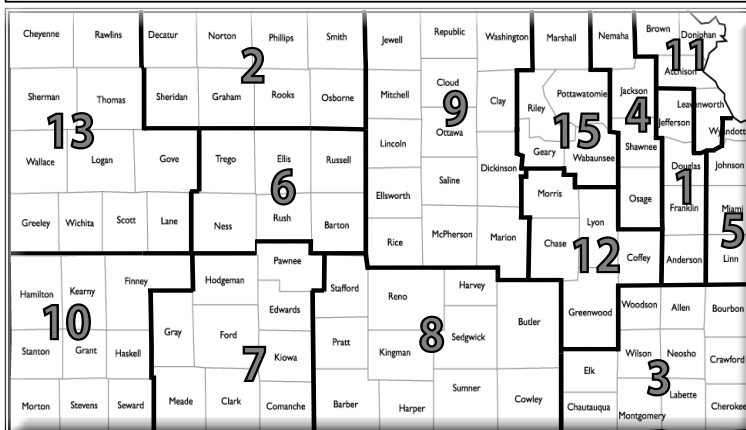

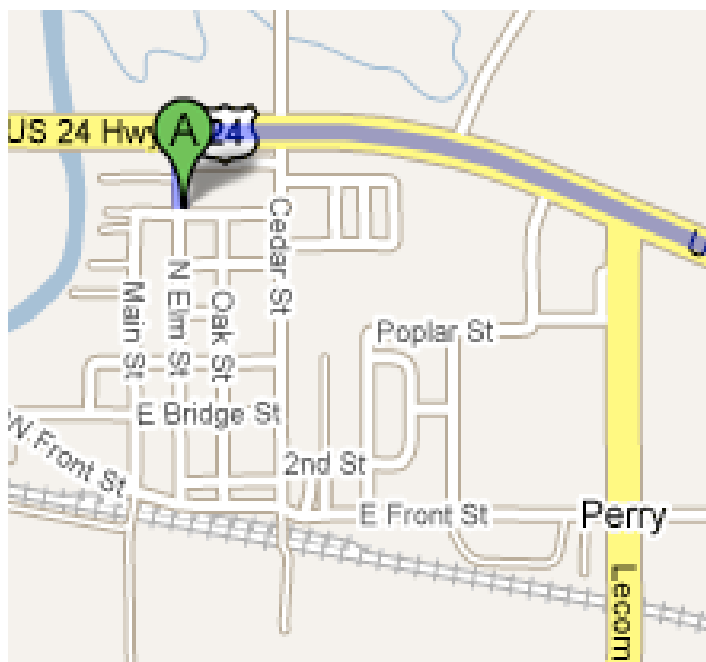

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I wear a helmet and be a member?

Yes, ABATE strives to ensure all motorcyclists reserve the right to choose to wear a helmet or not. ABATE's stance is not Anti-Helmet, but rather Anti-Helmet Law. The factors of helmet use are too complex for a simple statistic, so ABATE believes, before government law needlessly endanger lives, that such a decision should be left to the rider, and pursue other venues of motorcycle safety--primarily education and awareness.

Do I need to be a Harley owner?

No, ABATE is an advocate for the rights of all motorcyclists, regardless of what or where they ride.

Do I need to own a motorcycle?

No, ABATE consists of all advocates of motorcyclists and motorcycling. The rights of which may be supported by anyone who cares, and are welcome to do so.

Do I have to live in Kansas?

No, ABATE of Kansas has many non-Kansas-resident members who still ride in Kansas. ABATE of Kansas does not believe the rights of motorcyclists stop at the state borderline. ABATE of Kansas works with other state and national Motorcycle Rights Organizations (MROs) to preserve rights wherever the road leads.

Is ABATE a motorcycle club?

No, ABATE of Kansas is classified as a lobbying organization.

Which District can I belong to?

You can belong to any district

you prefer. Districts are divided by county groups, except District 20 which is mostly out-of-state members, however also choose districts adjacent to their state, if preferred. You may choose any district based on where you work, live, or have social ties. The only restriction is that you can only belong to one district at a time.

Why did I stop getting a newsletter?

Chances are most likely you have either moved or your membership has expired. Please check with your district or the ABATE of Kansas State office. It may also be you are not listed with your local post office. Please check with them to make sure you are listed at that address.

Do I need my ABATE card?

Yes, keep your membership card with you when you can. At events, it's faster and more reliable than roster checking. Also, many of your stops may give discounts for ABATE members.

Is ABATE just about helmets?

No, ABATE monitors all bills, laws, and regs that impact motorcycling, including manufacturing, operation, environment and education.

Do I need a permit to camp on leased area at Lake Perry?

Yes, permits are required by the Corp of Engineers which are requested and obtained from the ABATE of Kansas State office in Perry, the only exception being if you plan to camp during the Labor Day Rally event.

ABATE District #1 meeting was held Sunday, October 9, 2016 at 1PM, Johnny's Tavern, Lawrence, KS.

Nova H. opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence for our fallen brothers and sisters and Robert B.

State Report: Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF), Kansas MRF Rep Bill C. is requesting the annual donation from each district. Please see your newsletter to learn what this foundation provides for riders.

Mid-South M.I.L.E. (Motorcyclists Improving Legislative Effectiveness) – A change in the number of members/alternates that are sent to the 4 yearly meetings was reviewed. The change from paying to send 3 to now only paying to send 2 was voted on and passed. A Kansas basket for this year's annual seminar is being assembled and will be auctioned off at the seminar. All proceeds go to the M.I.L.E. Donations to this basket are being requested. A motion was made by Pam W. and seconded by Dora G. Motion passed by a show of hands that Dist. #1 will make a donation. State Treasurer, Richard B. requested an assistant treasurer. Lori H. was selected. She will

not be a board member.

Old business- Bear stated that Dist. 2 Donated a certain amount to the Dave Mann memorial fund.

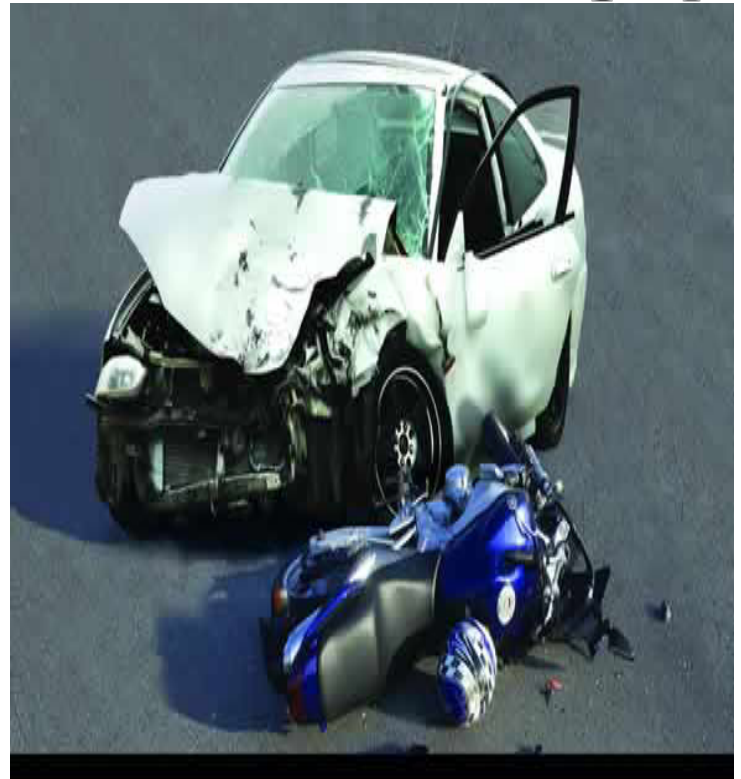

MRF Report for October 2016

The Meeting of the Minds in 2017 will be in Williamsburg, Virginia.

On October 5th 2016 over 75 organizations dedicated to highway safety gathered to hear details about a new initiative from the Department of Transportation called, "Road to Zero." Officials from the Department of Transportation (DOT), the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA), and The National Safety Council unveiled details of the initiative touting its commitment to eliminate all traffic-related deaths by the year 2030.

Officials spoke about "losing ground" when it comes to lowering death rates on the nations' roadways and pointed to the recently published statistic of a 7.2% increase in traffic deaths in 2015 which accounted for over 35,000 lives lost. Even more troubling were preliminary numbers for the first half of 2016 which shows a potentially even greater increase, currently projected to be 10.4%. Note that these numbers are for all traffic related deaths; not just motorcycles.

Specifics of the initiative were still in development with DOT authorities projecting a 12-18 month time frame for developing details of the long term plan. However, NHTSA

Administrator Mark Rosekind laid out three areas that he expected the initiative to center around which included the following:

1. Proactive Vehicle Safety: Ensuring that DOT and automakers have the tools necessary to ensure vehicle safety such as the ability to issue recalls and proactive safety measures like automatic emergency braking and lane infiltration detection systems.

2. Focus on Automotive Vehicle Technology: This area will center around a framework for self-driving vehicles with automated driving technology ensuring that the technology continues to advance in a way that will help to eliminate driver error resulting in "untold potential" in saving lives on the nations roadways.

3. New Solutions to Human Behavior: Referencing the statistics that 94% of crashes are due to driver error, the Road to Zero initiative would make this a key area of focus looking at concerns like distracted and drowsy driving as well as driving under the influence. According to officials, the key to making progress in these areas is to create a culture in the U.S. that engaging in these behaviors is unacceptable.

With the general parameters laid out, the conversation shifted to who and what groups would participate in developing the specifics of the long-term plan in achieving Road to

Zeros' objectives. There is currently a steering committee of 12 groups which include auto and equipment manufacturers, researchers and other entities such as the Governors' Institute for Highway Safety. In addition to the steering group, authorities proposed a role for all interested parties to play a role in the coalition which is likely to meet quarterly over the next 18 months. It was unclear if any motorcycle presence or viewpoints would be taken into consideration though generally the consensus was that DOT was interested in participation from all interested parties.

After the long term plan is developed, additional activities will take place including funding for grants for organizations that aid to achieve the objective laid out as well as a road map for policy, legislative and regulatory decision makers to incorporate into new or existing laws and regulations.

In addition to the steering committee and broader coalition, the point was made that Road to Zero would also engage with partners with similar objectives; namely Europe's 'Vision Zero' embraced by some U.S. cities and states as well as 'Toward Zero' which employs similar objectives. It should be noted that when Europe's own Vision Zero was introduced some years ago, motorcycles were a controversial subject with some

suggesting that they had no place in modern traffic systems.

Understanding that this initiative will be a major area of focus for regulators and policymakers over the next year, the (MRF) Motorcycle Riders Foundation will continue to be engaged in the coalition ensuring that motorcycles, bikers' rights, and a focus on motorcycle crash prevention remains a part of the dialogue as this initiative moves forward. In addition, the MRF will pay particularly close attention and seek unbiased answers as to how the initiatives under this program have played out in Europe and ensure these communications are made to policymakers in the U.S. as the program gets underway.
