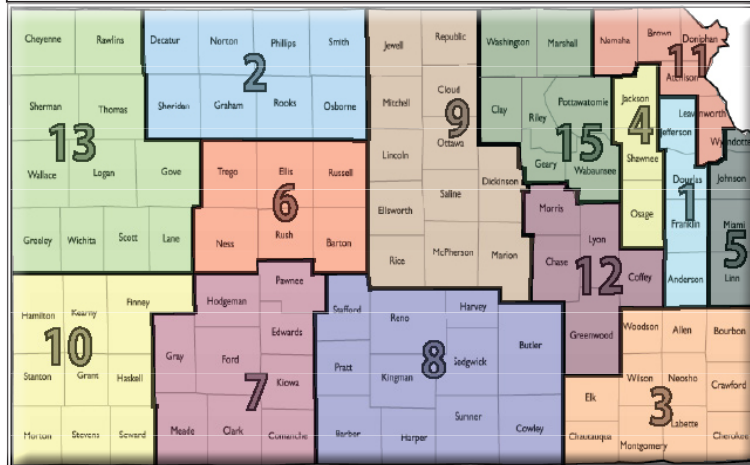

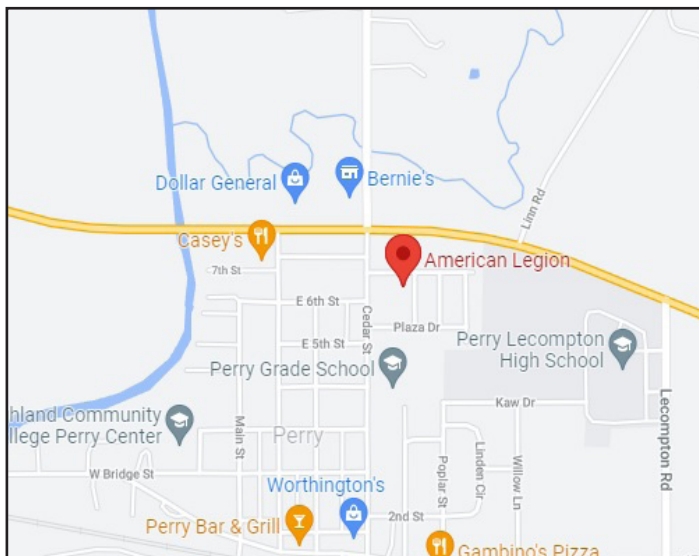

A.B.A.T.E. LAWYER REFERRAL SERVICE

At the State BOD meeting on February 13, 2021, the board voted unanimously to start a Lawyer Referral Service. Lawyers participating in the A.B.A.T.E. of Kansas Lawyer Referral Service will pay 10% of their fees from any injury claim to A.B.A.T.E. of Kansas in turn, referral fees received by the A.B.A.T.E. of Kansas Lawyer Referral Service will be used to fund the Mission of the organization.

While the goal is to always keep two wheels down, we all have experienced other motorists not keeping a lookout for motorcycles, turning in front of us, or driving while distracted. The Referral Service will ensure that attorneys participating in the program support the Mission of A.B.A.T.E. of Kansas, are motorcycle riders who are highly experienced in representing motorcyclists in Kansas, and understand the unique legal and insurance issues surrounding motorcyclists.

All injury claims - motorcycle, car, truck, semi, dangerous product, dangerous premises, etc. - qualify for the service. Additionally, in an effort to make sure that members have adequate insurance, lawyers participating in the referral service will be available to review insurance policies and coverages on members' policies at no cost.

Moving forward into legislative issues I have an appointment with Senator

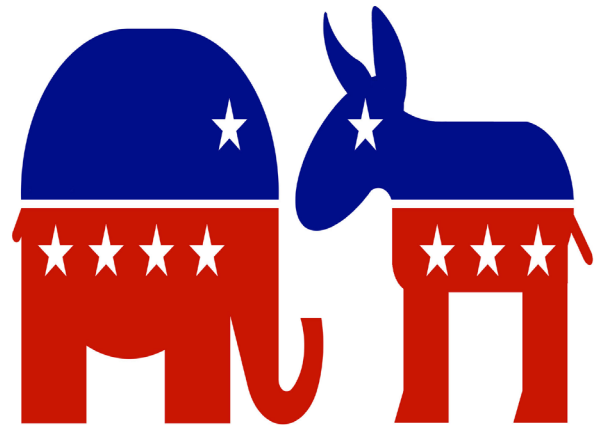

For our bikes, we shouldn't do the easy thing, which is to procrastinate. Plan to get any work done early, while the shops are less busy when others are procrastinating. If you do your own work, get those parts ordered soon. Heck, they are saying you better get your Christmas present orders done soon if you have any chance of getting things before the big day. Apparently the stories

of cargo ships sitting in the bays outside docks is very real. Same thing with motorcycle parts if they come from overseas, and even American companies are having difficulty getting the materials they use to manufacture their goods. As for us, especially those who are retired so can't rely on their job to help keep them in shape, we need to develop an exercise plan that will help keep the pounds off over the holidays and the winter months. Freedom of the Ride

There are things happening around our country that have become a big concern to me and should be a concern to all motorcyclists. One of those is the presence of more and more self-driving cars and trucks on the road. The biggest concern with autonomous vehicles is whether they will detect motorcycle riders. It's crucial that ABATE and the MRF have a seat at the table with both the Kansas and US Department of Transportation as they discuss a future with these type of vehicles on the road. It's up to us members to keep these agencies informed on how we feel about our safety when it comes to autonomous vehicles. ABATE and the MRF should always be included in DOT discussions, planning & decision making. For those who aren't familiar, MRF is an organization dedicated to protecting our motorcycle rights on the federal level in our nation's capital. Kansas riders should consider joining the MRF to help with this.

Another issue that concerns me is a recent email I received from the MRF explaining that the Governor of California signed a bill into law banning the sale of all off-road gas powered engines. This includes generators, lawn mowers, pressure washers, chainsaws,

weed trimmers and even golf carts. Under this new law these machines must have zero emissions which means they will either need to be battery powered or plug into an electrical outlet. Things that happen in California never stay in California. How long before this is happening all over the country? Could this be the beginning of the end for the internal combustion engine and the fuel to run them? What will this do to motorcycle and auto racing? As they are off-road, will there be bans on off road motorcycles?

These are just a few of the issues percolating around the country that show why it's so important that motorcyclists get involved in organizations like ABATE and the MRF. There is strength in numbers. In conclusion, I assure you ABATE of Kansas will be keeping tabs on any and all issues and legislation introduced relating to motorcycles. We will continue to fight for all our rights to ride and to Ride Free.

Tips for Riders

- Before riding, complete a rider's education course and obtain a class "M" endorsement on your driver's license.
- Always ride sober. Operating a motorcycle takes a great deal of mental focus and physical maneuvering, so alcohol or other impairing substances and motorcycles just don't mix.
- Riders should strategically use their lane position to see and be seen on the highway. Motorcyclists should also combine turn signals and hand signals to draw attention to themselves when switching lanes.

Tips for Motorists

- Remember the motorcycle is a vehicle with all the rights and privileges of any other motor vehicle on the highway; always allow a motorcyclist the full lane and never try to share a lane.
- Make a visual check for motorcycles by checking mirrors and blind spots before entering or leaving a lane of traffic and at intersections.
- Allow more following distance when traveling behind a motorcycle to permit enough time for the rider to maneuver or stop in an emergency.
- Never tailgate a motorcyclist.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I wear a helmet and be a member?

Yes, ABATE strives to ensure all motorcyclists reserve the right to choose to wear a helmet or not. ABATE's stance is not Anti-Helmet, but rather Anti-Helmet Law. The factors of helmet use are too complex for a simple statistic, so ABATE believes, before government law needlessly endanger lives, that such a decision should be left to the rider, and pursue other venues of motorcycle safety--primarily education and awareness.

Do I need to be a Harley owner?

No, ABATE is an advocate for the rights of all motorcyclists, regardless of what or where they ride.

Do I need to own a motorcycle?

No, ABATE consists of all advocates of motorcyclists and motorcycling. The rights of which may be supported by anyone who cares, and are welcome to do so.

Do I have to live in Kansas?

No, ABATE of Kansas has many non-Kansas-resident members who still ride in Kansas. ABATE of Kansas does not believe the rights of motorcyclists stop at the state borderline. ABATE of Kansas works with other state and national Motorcycle Rights Organizations (MROs) to preserve rights wherever the road leads.

Is ABATE a motorcycle club?

No, ABATE of Kansas is classified as a lobbying organization.

Which District can I belong to?

You can belong to any district you prefer. Districts are divided by county groups, except District 20 which is mostly out-of-state

members, however also choose districts adjacent to their state, if preferred. You may choose any district based on where you work, live, or have social ties. The only restriction is that you can only belong to one district at a time.

Why did I stop getting a newsletter?

Chances are most likely you have either moved or your membership has expired. Please check with your district or the ABATE of Kansas State office. It may also be you are not listed with your local post office. Please check with them to make sure you are listed at that address.

Do I need my ABATE card?

Yes, keep your membership card with you when you can. At events, it's faster and more reliable than roster checking. Also, many of your stops may give discounts for ABATE members.

Is ABATE just about helmets?

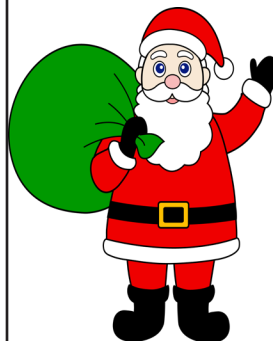
No, ABATE monitors all bills, laws, and regs that impact motorcycling, including manufacturing, operation, environment and education.

Do I need a permit to camp on leased area at Lake Perry?

Yes, permits are required by the Corp of Engineers which are requested and obtained from the ABATE of Kansas State office in Perry, the only exception being if you plan to camp during the Labor Day Rally event.

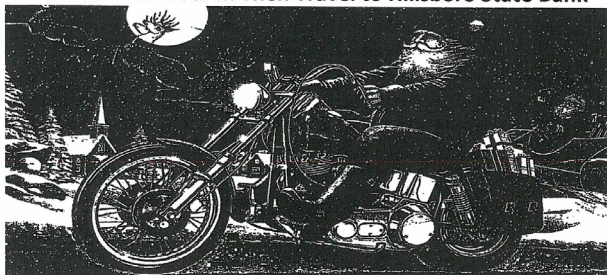
