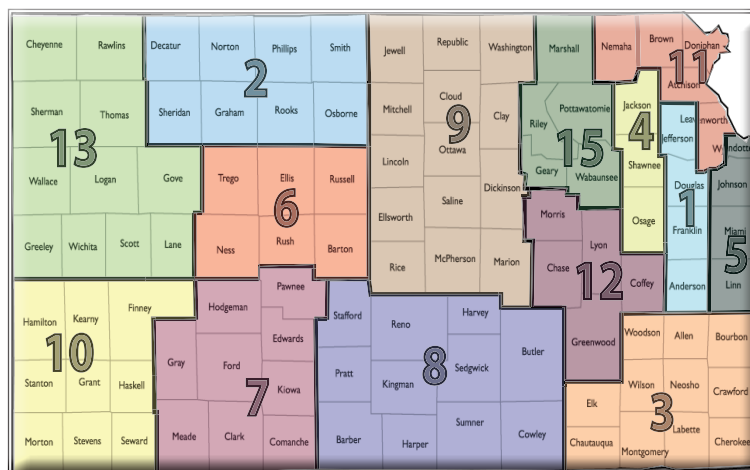

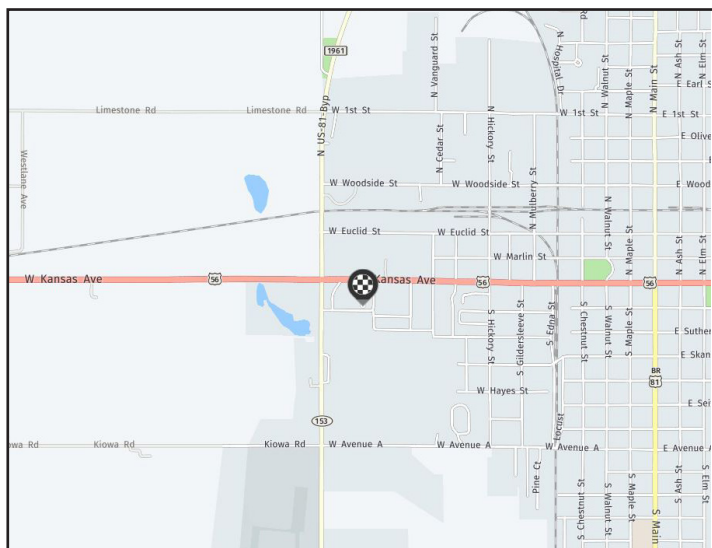

Ed for District 12 Guest speaker - Rodney asked that the roadway for the EMTS be blocked off next year so they can get in and out. Other than that, it was a good year. Fire reported it was a good year. Secretary report - motion made by Ed, second by Tony RR to waive the reading of the minutes. Motion passed with a show of hands.

Lobbyist Report

The number of Democratic presidential candidates is shrinking as some are not ranking well in the polls and others are not getting the funding necessary to continue campaigning. There will be more debates; I just don't know when they'll be scheduled. The big national news this week is Hurricane Dorian, which pretty much devastated a large part of the Bahamas.

Shake ups in Kansas political races are starting these days. Congressman Watkins is catching some negative publicity, so that position will likely be in contention in an increasing manner as candidates see him as vulnerable. For example, Jake LaTurner was going to run for Senator Pat Robert's position but has announced that he will run against Watkins. And of course Robert's position is up for grabs since he is retiring and will not seek re-election.

Things are pretty quiet at the State Capitol, aside from a few interim committee meetings and a newly created council to research the results of Medicaid expansion in other states. Committee appointments generally don't happen until late November or December, so while we anticipate that there won't be many changes, one never knows. While quiet now, we need to encourage our members to register to vote if they've not already done so. National Voter Registration Day is September 24th and is designed to help people get out and register, regardless of party affiliation. They even have a website at <https://nationalvoterregistrationday.org/>. Apathy and failure to vote do not give folks a voice in who is elected.

The State Motorcycle Task Force Committee met on Sep-

tember 4th at the Kansas Traffic Safety Resource Office, and we reviewed many reports with crash data, mostly national data. There have been 21 motorcycle fatalities so far this year in Kansas, although reporting is generally not current. Most crashes are single vehicle, and many are alcohol involved. We also agreed to continue the \$50 rebates for folks who take rider education classes again in the next fiscal year, assuming KDOT approves it.

I have also been appointed to a new Driver Education Advisory Committee as the lone representative from the motorcycling community. The initial orientation meeting is at the Department of Education building on September 30th. I will keep you informed as this progresses, but by all means, share any thoughts or concerns about driver and motorcycle education with me.

Also, be sure to discuss possible legislative topics at your District meetings and of course at the State Board meeting. We can't focus on topics unless we have ideas and proposals.

As always, I encourage our members to join the AMA and the MRF to have information on the current state of affairs in Washington, as well as state news. You can also get on their websites to sign up for email notifications.

Also, if you have personal contacts with your elected officials and can help connect me with them it would be appreciated. Personal relationships go a long way in pretty much every endeavor, be it work, personal, or legislative in nature.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I wear a helmet and be a member?

Yes, ABATE strives to ensure all motorcyclists reserve the right to choose to wear a helmet or not. ABATE's stance is not Anti-Helmet, but rather Anti-Helmet Law. The factors of helmet use are too complex for a simple statistic, so ABATE believes, before government law needlessly endanger lives, that such a decision should be left to the rider, and pursue other venues of motorcycle safety--primarily education and awareness.

Do I need to be a Harley owner?

No, ABATE is an advocate for the rights of all motorcyclists, regardless of what or where they ride.

Do I need to own a motorcycle?

No, ABATE consists of all advocates of motorcyclists and motorcycling. The rights of which may be supported by anyone who cares, and are welcome to do so.

Do I have to live in Kansas?

No, ABATE of Kansas has many non-Kansas-resident members who still ride in Kansas. ABATE of Kansas does not believe the rights of motorcyclists stop at the state borderline. ABATE of Kansas works with other state and national Motorcycle Rights Organizations (MROs) to preserve rights wherever the road leads.

Is ABATE a motorcycle club?

No, ABATE of Kansas is classified as a lobbying organization.

Which District can I belong to?

You can belong to any district you prefer. Districts are divided by county groups, except District 20 which is mostly out-of-state members, however also choose

districts adjacent to their state, if preferred. You may choose any district based on where you work, live, or have social ties. The only restriction is that you can only belong to one district at a time.

Why did I stop getting a newsletter?

Chances are most likely you have either moved or your membership has expired. Please check with your district or the ABATE of Kansas State office. It may also be you are not listed with your local post office. Please check with them to make sure you are listed at that address.

Do I need my ABATE card?

Yes, keep your membership card with you when you can. At events, it's faster and more reliable than roster checking. Also, many of your stops may give discounts for ABATE members.

Is ABATE just about helmets?

No, ABATE monitors all bills, laws, and regs that impact motorcycling, including manufacturing, operation, environment and education.

Do I need a permit to camp on leased area at Lake Perry?

Yes, permits are required by the Corp of Engineers which are requested and obtained from the ABATE of Kansas State office in Perry, the only exception being if you plan to camp during the Labor Day Rally event.

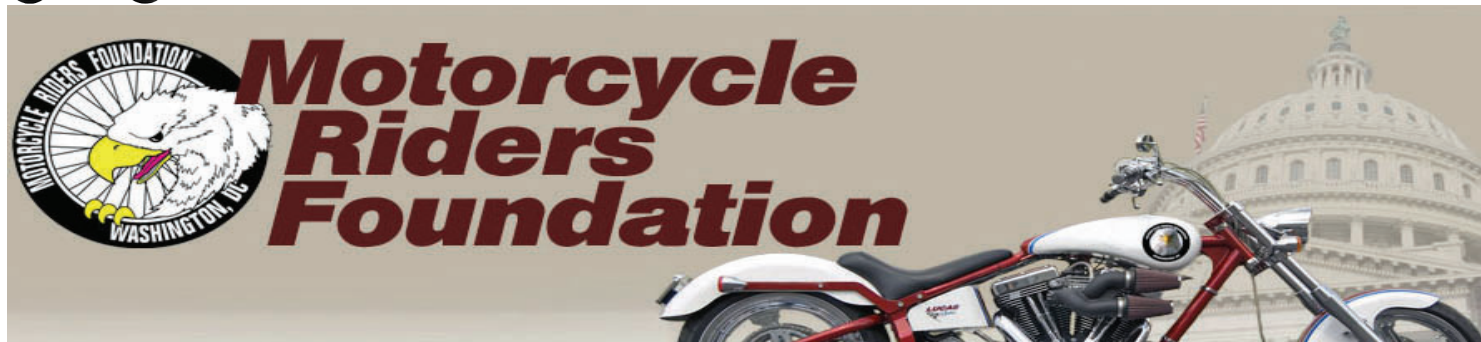

In late 2015 Congress passed the Fast Act Bill known as Fixing American Surface Transportation Act which was Section 4007: Stop Motorcycle Checkpoint Funding.

Notwithstanding section 153 of title 23, United States Code, the Secretary may not provide a grant of any funds to a State, county, town, township, Indian tribe, municipality, or other local government that may be used for any programs-1 to check helmet usage. Or 2 to create checkpoints to target motorcycle operators and motorcycle passengers.

The Fast Act is only valid until the end of 2020. It is up to the motorcycle community to ensure that the ban on motorcycle-only checkpoints have no federal funding and motorcycle-only checkpoints issues are included in the new legislation.

After a 6 week recess, the House and Senate returned to work on September 9. The MRF team logged 59 Hill meetings during this recess.

The MRF is at 76 co-sponsors from 33

States and one territory for House Resolution 255, the motorcycle profiling resolution.

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation has been meeting with lawmakers on the committee in the House and Senate to make our case. The MRF will reach out to state chap-

ters to help with their elected officials. We must educate our lawmakers that motorcyclists will not accept being targeted just because we ride.

Unfortunately, Kansas and Oklahoma have not got onboard and I ride in both of these states so if you have a chance to meet with any of our legislators ask them why are they sitting idle on this issue?

By the next newsletter, Tony R.R. and I will have attended the 35th Annual Meeting of the Minds in Bloomington, Minnesota where we will attend conferences and workshops to further educate us so we can bring this information back to our fellow riders.

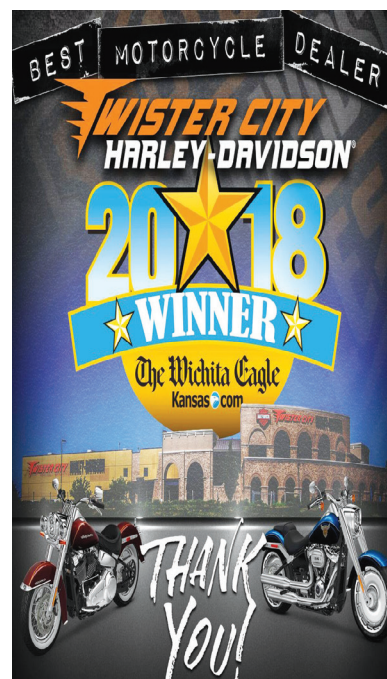
